16 facilities is economically beneficial to the State of Arkansas, the
17 Department of Correction may, after receiving approval of the Chief Fiscal
18 Officer, and seeking prior review and approval by the Arkansas Legislative
19 Council or Joint Budget Committee, transfer from any line item appropriation
20 contained in Section 3 of this Act into the Professional Fees and Services
21 line item contained in Section 3 of this Act to operate new facilities.
22 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
23 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
24 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
25 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
26 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
27 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly
28 has determined that the Department of Correction may operate more efficiently
29 if some flexibility is provided to the Department of Correction authorizing
30 broad powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and

7 APPROPRIATION TRANSFER FOR CONSTRUCTING AND EQUIPPING. The Department of
8 Correction is hereby authorized to transfer appropriations between any line
9 items authorized herein but only for the purpose of financing construction or
10 equipment for a facility of the department. Any transfers authorized by this
11 section shall require the approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State
12 after prior review and approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
13 Committee.

14 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
15 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
16 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by

2 line items to Professional Fees and Services upon approval by the Chief
3 Fiscal Officer of the State and after receiving prior review and approval by
4 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.

5 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
6 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
7 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
8 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and

27 Correction, shall at a minimum and on a fiscal year basis, prepare and post
28 on the applicable agency web site, a monthly summary of county jail
29 reimbursement invoices prepared and forwarded to each county sheriff for
30 verification by the Departments and for payment from the County Jail
31 Reimbursement Fund. In addition, the report shall include a summary of
32 invoices returned by each county for payment for previous months within the
33 fiscal year, the amounts paid, and any balances owed. Each fiscal year-end
34 report shall be maintained on the web sites for a period of no less than
35 three (3) years.

1 SECTION 31. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. MOTOR
3 VEHICLE PURCHASE PROVISION. The Department of Correction is hereby
4 authorized to purchase motor vehicles as may be approved for the purpose of
5 equipping new bed additions at the various institutions from the
6 appropriations authorized for Capital Outlay in Section 3 of this Act.

7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2013~~

10 SECTION 32. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
12 OF APPROPRIATION TO THE COUNTY JAIL REIMBURSEMENT FUND. If any savings of
13 general revenue appropriation and funds accrue during the ~~2013-2014~~2014-2015
14 fiscal year in the operations of the Department of Correction, the Director
15 of the Department of Correction may request a transfer of appropriation from
16 any line item appropriation in the Inmate Care and Custody Fund Account to
17 the County Jail Reimbursement Fund in order to meet obligations to counties
18 for housing state inmates. Such transfer request shall be made upon the
19 approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and prior review and
20 approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.

24 SECTION 33. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
25 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LOCAL
26 GOVERNMENT INMATE COST REPORT. Each calendar year, the Association of
27 Arkansas Counties shall compile and submit a report to the Arkansas
28 Legislative Council, of all costs incurred, excluding construction costs, by
29 local government units housing inmates sentenced to the Department of
30 Correction and Department of Community Correction. The cost report shall be
31 a representative sample of all counties housing and caring for state inmates.
32 The report shall be submitted no later than July 1 of the calendar year
33 immediately following the reporting year.

34 The Association of Arkansas Counties in coordination with Legislative
35 Audit shall determine which counties will be included in the sample and shall
36 include a sufficient number of counties from each classification based upon

1 population and each congressional district to ensure a fair representation of
2 costs incurred. Guidelines for preparing this cost report shall be developed
3 by the Division of Legislative Audit in coordination with the Association of
4 Arkansas Counties. The Division of Legislative Audit shall test the accuracy
5 of the information submitted during the routine audit of the applicable
6 county.

10 SECTION 34. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

12 SERVICES STIPEND. The Arkansas Department of Correction (ADC) may award
13 additional compensation to those exempt employees who are members of the
14 emergency response unit. These employees are eligible to receive up to 3% per
15 hour additional compensation for the actual number of hours that an employee
16 spends on an emergency response action.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2013~~
18 2014 through June 30, ~~2014~~ 2015.

20 SECTION 35. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. USE OF
22 MARKETING AND REDISTRIBUTION PROCEEDS FROM SALE OF STATE PROPERTY. The
23 proceeds from the sale of state property through the Marketing and
24 Redistribution Section of the Department of Finance and Administration, may
25 be deposited into the Cash in State Treasury fund in an amount not to exceed
26 \$100,000 there to be used for operating expenses for the Paws in Prison
27 program.

28 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2013~~

31 SECTION 36. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
32 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
33 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
34 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
35 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
36 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal

1 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
2 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
3 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.
4

5 SECTION 37. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
6 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
7 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
8 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
9 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
10 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
11 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
12 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
13

14 SECTION 38. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
15 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
16 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
17 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2014 is essential to the operation of
18 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
19 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
20 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2014 could work irreparable harm
21 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
22 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
23 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
24 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2014.
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
