## For An Act To Be Entitled

8 AN ACT TO CREATE A GOOD SAMARITAN LAW FOR *ARCHITECTS*  
9 *AND ENGINEERS*; TO AMEND THE LAW CONCERNING *ARCHITECTS*  
10 *AND ENGINEERS*; TO PROVIDE PROTECTION TO CERTAIN  
11 *ARCHITECTS AND ENGINEERS*; PROVIDING VOLUNTEER  
12 SERVICES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.


15 *TO CREATE A GOOD SAMARITAN LAW FOR*  
16 *ARCHITECTS AND ENGINEERS; TO AMEND THE*

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24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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26 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 17, Chapter 15, Subchapter 1, is  
27 amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

28 17-15-106. "Good Samaritan" law.

29 (a) If a registered architect or professional engineer voluntarily,  
30 without compensation other than expense reimbursement, provides  
31 architectural, structural, electrical, mechanical, or other design  
32 professional services related to a declared national, state, or local  
33 emergency caused by an earthquake, hurricane, tornado, fire, explosion,  
34 collapse, or other similar disaster or catastrophic event, at the request of  
35 or with the approval of a national, state, or local public official, law  
36 enforcement official, public safety official, or building inspection official



1 believed by the registered architect or professional engineer to be acting in  
2 his or her official capacity, the registered architect or professional  
3 engineer shall not be liable for any personal injury, wrongful death,  
4 property damage, or other loss of any nature related to the registered  
5 architect's or professional engineer's acts, errors, or omissions in the  
6 performance of any architectural or engineering services for any structure,  
7 building, facility, project utility, equipment, machine, process, piping, or  
8 other system, either publicly or privately owned.

9 (b) The immunity provided under subsection (a) of this section shall  
10 apply only to a voluntary architectural or engineering service that occurs  
11 during the emergency or within ninety (90) days following the end of the  
12 period for an emergency, or other similar disaster or catastrophic event,  
13 unless extended by an executive order issued by the Governor under the  
14 Governor's emergency executive powers.

15 (c) This section does not provide immunity for wanton, willful, or  
16 intentional misconduct.

17 (d) As used in this section:

18 (1) "Building inspection official" means an appointed or elected  
19 federal, state, or local official with the executive responsibility to  
20 coordinate building inspection in the jurisdiction in which an emergency or  
21 event has occurred;

22 (2) "Law enforcement official" means an appointed or elected  
23 federal, state, or local official with the executive responsibility to  
24 coordinate law enforcement in the jurisdiction in which an emergency or event  
25 has occurred;

26 (3) "Professional engineer" means a person licensed as an  
27 engineer under a state's engineering licensure laws.

28 (4) "Public official" means a federal, state, or local elected  
29 official with the executive responsibility in the jurisdiction in which an  
30 emergency or event has occurred;

31 (5) "Public safety official" means an appointed or elected  
32 federal, state, or local official with the executive responsibility to  
33 coordinate public safety in the jurisdiction in which an emergency or event  
34 has occurred; and

35 (6) "Registered architect" means a person licensed under a  
36 state's architectural licensure laws as a registered architect.

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*SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 17, Chapter 30, Subchapter 1, is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:*

*17-30-106. "Good Samaritan" law.*

*A professional engineer who voluntarily without compensation other than expense reimbursement, provides architectural, structural, electrical, mechanical, or other design professional services related to a declared national, state, or local emergency caused by an earthquake, hurricane, tornado, fire, explosion, collapse, or other similar disaster or catastrophic event, shall be subject to the provisions and protection of § 17-15-106.*
