26	Development fund from the previous fiscal year;
27	(3) A budget for the current fiscal year Work Force 2020
28	Development fund;
29	(4) A summary of activities outlining the workforce development
30	training and mission and how funding from the Work Force 2020 Development
31	fund is to be used to fulfill that mission; and
32	(5) Other information available to explain and justify the
33	continued use and need for Work Force 2020 Development funding.

35	SECTION 8. DO NOT CODIFY. (a) The Governor shall call the first
36	meeting of the Career Education and Workforce Development Board within ninety

	(90) days after the appointment of the industry members.
2	(b) The Governor shall appoint a voting member as chair of the board
3	to serve a one-year term.
4	
5	SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
6	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that Arkansas workforce education
7	operates within a variety of agencies without coordination, often with
8	significant inefficiencies arising from overlapping and repeated programming;
9	that this act will bring workforce education programs together under a single
10	umbrella agency; and that this act is immediately necessary because the
11	effectiveness of this act is essential to the operation of the programs for
12	which appropriations will be provided, and that in the event of an extension
13	of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this act could
14	work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of
15	essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is declared to
16	exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the
17	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
18	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
19	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
20	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
21	bill; or
22	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
23	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
