9 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO
10 EXPAND THE CAPACITY OF THE ARKANSAS AUTISM
11 PARTNERSHIP; TO PROVIDE INTENSIVE EARLY INTERVENTION
12 TREATMENT FOR ADDITIONAL CHILDREN DIAGNOSED WITH
13 AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDERS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

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16 TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN
17 SERVICES TO EXPAND THE CAPACITY OF THE
18 ARKANSAS AUTISM PARTNERSHIP.
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22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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24 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 20-77-124 is amended to read as follows:
25 20-77-124. Medicaid waiver for autism.

26 (a) As used in this section:

27 (1)(A) "Intensive early intervention individualized therapy
28 services" means intensive early intervention individualized therapy for a
29 child with a pervasive developmental disorder, including without limitation:

30 (i) Behavioral therapies such as applied behavioral
31 analysis and pivotal response training under the supervision of a behavior
32 analyst who is board-certified by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board;
33 (ii) Intensive speech therapy provided by a licensed
34 speech therapist; and

35 (iii) Intensive occupational therapy provided by a
36 licensed occupational therapist.



1 (B) Except as provided in subdivision (a)(1)(C) of this
2 section, "intensive early intervention individualized therapy services" does
3 not include coverage for services to treat developmental disorders of
4 language, early onset psychosis, dementia, obsessive compulsive disorder,
5 schizoid personality disorder, avoidant personality disorder, or reactive
6 attachment disorder.

7 (C) If a child with a pervasive developmental disorder is
8 diagnosed to have one (1) or more of the conditions listed in subdivision
9 (a)(1)(B) of this section, intensive early intervention individualized
10 therapy services includes coverage only for therapy necessary to treat the
11 pervasive developmental disorder; and

12 (2) "Pervasive developmental disorders", commonly known as
13 autism spectrum disorders, means a neurobiological condition characterized by
14 severe deficits and pervasive impairment in multiple areas of development
15 diagnosed by a team evaluation including at least a licensed physician, a
16 licensed psychologist, and a licensed speech pathologist for an individual
17 with a developmental disability as defined in § 20-48-101, including without
18 limitation:

- 19 (A) Asperger's disorder;
- 20 (B) Autism;
- 21 (C) Pervasive developmental disorder, not otherwise
22 specified;
- 23 (D) Rett's disorder; and
- 24 (E) Childhood disintegrative disorder.

25 (b)(1) The Department of Human Services shall seek a Medicaid waiver
26 from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to provide intensive
27 early intervention individualized therapy services to any child who has been
28 diagnosed with a pervasive developmental disorder.

29 (2)(A) The waiver shall be for children three (3) years of age
30 through ten (10) years of age.

31 (B) ~~No~~ A child shall not participate in the Medicaid
32 waiver under this section for more than three (3) years.

33 (C) The Medicaid waiver under this section shall not pay
34 more than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) annually per child.

35 (3) The waiver shall seek to develop skills of children in the
36 areas of cognition, behavior, communication, and social interaction.

1 (c)(1) The department shall apply for the Medicaid waiver under this
2 section only as funding becomes available for that purpose.

3 (2) No later than January 1, 2016, the department shall apply to
4 add an additional fifty (50) eligibility slots to the Medicaid waiver for
5 autism, to the extent that appropriation and funding are available.

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
