A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Part 3 of Article 4 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia
2 Annotated, relating to carrying and possession of firearms, so as to require the issuance of
3 weapon carry license renewal notices; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting
4 laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 1.**

7 Part 3 of Article 4 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
8 relating to carrying and possession of firearms, is amended by adding a new subsection to
9 Code Section 16-11-129, relating to weapons carry license, gun safety information,
10 temporary renewal permit, mandamus, and verification of license, to read as follows:

11 "(a.2) **Renewal notices.**

12 (1) For each weapons carry license or renewal license issued on and after July 1, 2020,
13 the judge of the probate court which issued such license, or his or her successor, shall
14 provide notice to the person who holds such license of the expiration date of his or her
15 license and information about current requirements and procedures for license renewal.
16 The form of such notice shall be as provided for by the Council of Probate Court Judges
17 of Georgia. Such notice shall be sent not more than 90 days, but not fewer than 30 days,
18 before the expiration date of such person's license and may be sent either electronically
19 to the electronic address or by first-class mail to the physical address, which appears on
20 the application used for issuing such license.

21 (2) The judge of the probate court's issuance or nonissuance of the notice provided for
22 under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall have no effect upon the requirements of this
23 Code section."

25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
