A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 2 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,  
2 relating to jurisdiction of the state, so as to nullify certain federal laws; to provide that any  
3 federal law which attempts to govern firearms manufactured within this state shall be  
4 unenforceable; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other  
5 purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Article 2 of Chapter 2 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to  
9 jurisdiction of the state, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

10 "50-2-29.

11 (a) No public servant or dealer selling any firearm in this state shall enforce or attempt to  
12 enforce any federal act, law, statute, rule, or regulation relating to a firearm, firearm  
13 accessory, or ammunition that is sold, owned, or manufactured commercially or privately  
14 in Georgia and that remains exclusively within the borders of this state.

15 (b) The Attorney General may defend a citizen of this state in a federal prosecution for  
16 violation of a federal law relating to the manufacture, sale, transfer, or possession of a  
17 firearm, firearm accessory, or ammunition owned or manufactured and retained exclusively  
18 within the borders of this state.

19 (c) Any federal law, rule, regulation, or order which becomes effective on or after January  
20 1, 2014, which:

21 (1) Bans or restricts ownership of a firearm, including, but not limited to, a  
22 semiautomatic firearm or any magazine of a firearm; or

23 (2) Requires any firearm, magazine, or other firearm accessory to be registered in any  
24 manner

25 shall be unenforceable within this state."

26 **SECTION 2.**

27 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law  
28 without such approval.

29 **SECTION 3.**

30 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
