A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To create the Sandersville School Building Authority; to provide for a short title; to confer
- 2 powers and impose duties on the authority; to provide for the membership and the
- 3 appointment of members of the authority and their terms of office, qualifications, duties, and
- 4 powers; to provide for vacancies, organization, meetings, and expenses; to provide for
- 5 definitions; to provide for the transfer of property; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 6 purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

9 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Sandersville School Building Authority

10 Act."

11 SECTION 2.

- 12 There is created a body corporate and politic to be known as the Sandersville School
- Building Authority. By that name, style, and title, such body may contract and be contracted
- with, sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, and complain and defend in all courts of
- 15 law and equity, except that the authority or the trustee acting under the trust indenture shall
- in no event be liable for any torts committed by any of the officers, agents, and employees.
- 17 The authority shall not be a state institution nor a department or agency of the state but shall
- 18 be an instrumentality of the state, a mere creation of the state, having a distinct corporate
- 19 entity. The authority shall have its principal office in the Town of Sandersville, and its legal
- 20 situs or residence for the purposes of this Act shall be Washington County. The authority
- 21 is granted the same exemptions and exclusions from taxes as are now granted to cities and
- 22 counties for the operation of facilities similar to facilities to be operated by the authority as
- 23 provided under the provisions of this Act.

SECTION 3.

The authority is created for the purpose of acquiring, maintaining, developing, owning, and 25 26 operating the building and grounds of the former Sandersville Elementary School in 27 Sandersville, Georgia, in a manner that preserves this historic building, makes use of this space for cultural, artistic, and community endeavors, and generates revenues for the 28 29 maintenance, improvement, and preservation of the facility and its grounds. The authority 30 shall have perpetual existence. Any change in name or composition of the authority shall in no way affect the vested rights of any person under this part or impair the obligations of any 31 32 contracts existing under this part.

33 SECTION 4.

- 34 (a)(1) The authority shall consist of nine members selected as provided in this subsection.
- 35 The initial members shall be appointed by the Governor and shall be as provided in
- paragraph (2) of this subsection. The Governor shall designate four members to serve
- 37 two-year terms and five members to serve four-year terms, and until their successors have
- been appointed. Thereafter, members shall be appointed by the authority from nominations
- made by the county commission, which shall nominate candidates for each vacancy. The
- 40 terms of the members of the authority shall be for four years, beginning on July 1 of the
- 41 year of their appointment, and until their successors have been appointed. Members of the
- authority may succeed themselves in office.
- 43 (2) Membership of the authority shall be residents of Washington County and shall include
- the following:
- 45 (A) One representative of the Washington County Historical Society;
- 46 (B) Two representatives of the arts community, one from visual arts and one from the
- 47 local theater;
- 48 (C) One representative of the kaolin industry;
- 49 (D) One representative of the agricultural community, including agribusiness and the
- 50 Cooperative Extension Service;
- 51 (E) One representative of the Chamber of Commerce; and
- 52 (F) Three members drawn from the community at large who have demonstrated a record
- of promoting Washington County and its welfare as well as having an interest in the
- welfare and promotion of the Sandersville school building.
- 55 (b) Any vacancy on the authority shall be filled for the remainder of the vacant term by the
- 56 authority by appointment from nominations made by the county commissioner. Three
- 57 nominations shall be made for each vacancy.
- 58 (c) Five members of the authority shall constitute a quorum, and the affirmative votes of
- 59 four members shall be required for any action by the authority. No vacancy on the authority

shall impair the right of the quorum to exercise all the rights and perform all the duties of the

- 61 authority.
- 62 (d) The authority shall make rules and regulations for its own government. It shall have
- 63 perpetual existence.
- 64 (e) The authority shall elect its own officers.
- 65 (f) The members of the authority shall receive no compensation for their services on the
- authority but may receive reimbursement for expenses associated with their services pursuant
- 67 to rules to be adopted by the authority.
- 68 (g) The members of the authority shall be accountable in all respects as trustees. The
- 69 authority shall keep suitable and proper books and records of all receipts, income, and
- 70 expenditures of every kind and shall submit for inspection all the books, together with the
- 71 proper statement of the authority's financial position, to the state auditor.

72 SECTION 5.

- 73 The authority shall meet at such times as may be necessary to transact the business coming
- before it, but not less than quarterly. All meetings shall be called, noticed, and conducted in
- accordance with Chapter 14 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated. Motions,
- 76 resolutions, and all other proceedings of the authority and all documents and records shall
- be open to public inspection, except as authorized by provisions of the Georgia open records
- 78 laws.

SECTION 6.

- 80 All funds deposited by the authority in any bank shall be placed in the name of the authority
- 81 and shall be withdrawn or paid out only by check or draft on the bank, signed by the
- 82 secretary-treasurer and countersigned by the chairperson a vice chairperson of the authority.

83 SECTION 7.

- 84 The authority shall have the power:
- 85 (1) To adopt a seal and alter the same at its pleasure. The seal shall be impressed upon
- instruments of the authority, and any executed instrument bearing the seal of the authority
- shall be prima-facie evidence of its execution by the authority and that its execution was
- duly, regularly, and legally authorized by the authority;
- 89 (2) To receive and administer gifts, grants, and donations;
- 90 (3) To acquire in its own name by grant, purchase, gift, devise, or lease and to hold, use,
- sell, lease, or dispose of real and personal property of every kind and nature whatsoever,
- licenses, patents, rights, and interest necessary for the full, convenient, or useful exercise
- of carrying out any of its powers pursuant to this Act;

94 (4) To acquire, develop, own, operate, and maintain the former buildings and grounds of

- 95 Sandersville Elementary School, including power to acquire by purchase, lease, gift, or
- otherwise all or any part of any patents, licenses, rights, interest, engineering studies, data,
- or reports owned or held by any person, firm, or corporation and determined by the
- authority to be necessary, convenient, or useful to the authority in connection with the
- 99 acquisition, construction, completion, development, operation, or maintenance of such
- 100 building;
- 101 (5) To appoint, select, and employ officers, agents, and employees and provide for their
- personnel services and benefits, including payroll, insurance, and retirement programs;
- 103 (6) To enter into contracts with consultants and independent contractors, including
- engineering, architectural, and construction experts, fiscal agents, and attorneys, and to fix
- their respective compensation;
- 106 (7) To make contracts, intergovernmental agreements, and leases and to execute all
- instruments necessary or convenient, including contracts for the acquisition of existing
- transportation facilities, acquisition of new facilities and property, managerial and
- operating services, and such other matters and things as may be needful and necessary to
- the proper and efficient operation of the business of the authority;
- 111 (8) To accept loans and grants or to accept loans or grants of money or materials or
- property of any kind from the United States of America or any agency or instrumentality
- or political subdivision thereof or from any other source, upon such terms and conditions
- as the United States of America or such agency or instrumentality or other source may
- 115 impose;
- 116 (9) To accept loans and grants or to accept loans or grants of money or materials or
- property of any kind from the State of Georgia or any agency or instrumentality or political
- subdivision thereof or from any other source, upon such terms and conditions as the State
- of Georgia or such agency or instrumentality or political subdivision or any other source
- may impose;
- 121 (10) To borrow money for any of its corporate purposes and to execute evidence of such
- indebtedness by promissory notes or otherwise, to secure the same, and to provide for the
- payment of the same and for the rights of the holders thereof;
- 124 (11) To exercise any power usually possessed by private corporations performing similar
- functions which is not in conflict with the Constitution and laws of this state;
- 126 (12) To do all things necessary or convenient to exercise and carry out the powers
- especially given in this Act;
- 128 (13) To make rules and bylaws for the orderly operation of the authority;
- 129 (14) To sue and to be sued in its corporate name in all courts of competent jurisdiction;

130 (15) To accumulate its funds from year to year and to invest the same in any manner that instrumentalities of the State of Georgia or any of its political subdivisions may be 131 invested; and 132 133 (16) To procure and enter into contracts for any type of insurance and indemnity against loss or damage to its property from any cause, including loss or use and occupancy, against 134 135 death or injury of any person, against employees' liability, against any act of any member, officer, or employee of the authority in the performance of the duties of his or her office, 136 or against employment of any other insurance risk. 137

All construction contracts and all contracts for the purchase of supplies, equipment, and services when the expense thereof exceeds \$10,000.00 shall be awarded to the lowest, qualified, or best bidder, after advertising for bids therefor has been published twice in the legal organs of the counties within the jurisdiction of the authority. The authority shall have the right to reject any or all bids or parts of any or all bids when such rejection is deemed necessary by the authority.

145 **SECTION 9.**

The authority shall become active on July 1, 2015, or when all members of the authority have been appointed, whichever is later. If the authority is abolished or becomes inactive through the failure to appoint members, ownership of the Sandersville school building shall be transferred to Washington County.

150 **SECTION 10.**

151 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
