A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing February, 2015, as Self-Care Month; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, self-care is a lifelong daily habit of healthy lifestyle choices, good hygiene
- 3 practices, prevention of infection and illness, avoiding unhealthy choices, monitoring for
- 4 signs and symptoms of changes in health, knowing when to consult a health care practitioner,
- 5 and knowing when it is appropriate to self-treat conditions; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the United States Food and Drug Administration deems over-the-counter
- 7 medicines safe and effective for the self-care treatment of minor, acute, and chronic health
- 8 conditions and symptoms such as pain, the common cold, allergies, and other conditions that
- 9 impact large segments of the population; and
- 10 WHEREAS, over-the-counter medicines are either developed as new nonprescription
- 11 medicines or switched from existing prescription medicines; and
- 12 WHEREAS, over-the-counter nonprescription medicines are self-care products that
- 13 consumers purchase in pharmacies, supermarkets, retail stores, and online; and
- 14 WHEREAS, every dollar spent on over-the-counter medicines saves the United States health
- 15 care system \$6-7 each year, totaling \$102 billion in annual savings; and
- 16 WHEREAS, nonprescription medicines help to ease the burden on health care practitioners,
- 17 eliminating unnecessary medical examinations that could be avoided with appropriate
- 18 self-care; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Georgia benefits when its citizens practice appropriate self-care; do not
- 20 unnecessarily visit health care practitioners; and are empowered by higher self-esteem,
- 21 improved health, and reduced use of health care services; and

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WHEREAS, Georgia encourages its citizens to take advantage of self-care's potential to

- 23 improve personal and public health, save personal and public treasury, and strengthen the
- 24 sustainability of Georgia's health care system; and
- 25 WHEREAS, achieving self-care's potential is a shared opportunity for consumers, health care
- 26 practitioners, policymakers, and regulators.
- 27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 28 the members of this body recognize the importance of improving awareness of self-care and
- 29 the value it represents to the citizens of Georgia, support increased consumer empowerment
- 30 through the development of new nonprescription medicines and the appropriate switch of
- 31 certain prescription medicines to nonprescription, acknowledge that over-the-counter
- 32 medicines can greatly improve and reduce costs to the public health system, and encourage
- 33 consumers, health care practitioners, policymakers, and regulators to communicate the
- 34 benefits of self-care.
- 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 36 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 37 public and the press.
