



HOUSE BILL No. 1253

DIGEST OF HB 1253 (Updated February 14, 2019 12:55 pm - DI 123)

Citations Affected: IC 5-2; IC 10-14; IC 10-21.

Synopsis: Handgun training for teachers. Creates a specialized firearms safety, education, and training curriculum (curriculum) for teachers, school staff, and school employees. Specifies curriculum requirements. Authorizes funds from the Indiana safe schools fund (fund) to be used for curriculum related expenses. Provides that the identity of any person who: (1) receives a grant from the fund; or (2) enrolls in, participates in, or completes certain specialized firearm instruction; is confidential. Makes conforming amendments.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

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January 10, 2019, read first time and referred to Committee on Education. February 11, 2019, amended, reported — Do Pass. February 14, 2019, read second time, amended, ordered engrossed.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning public safety.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

16	(B) a disciplinary complaint or disciplinary investigation;

18	(D) any proceeding or investigation comparable to those

20	(3) authorized by:
21	(A) a school board (as defined by IC 20-26-9-4); or

32	Sec. 4. A grant provided to a teacher, school staff member, or
33	school employee under section 3 of this chapter must be used by the
34	teacher, staff member, or employee to enroll in a course of
35	specialized firearms instruction that:
36	(1) is taught by an instructor who is or instructors who are
37	qualified to provide instruction in the topics described in
38	subdivision (2); and
39	(2) consists of the following topics:
40	(A) Not less than one (1) hour of general firearms safety.

20	(iv) Shooting at multiple targets.
21	(v) Shooting while moving to and from cover.
22	(E) Not less than one (1) hour on the topic on firearms
23	retention. This topic shall consist of the following
24	subtopics:
25	(i) Retention of a handgun while holstered.
26	(ii) Retention of a handgun while drawn.
27	(iii) Retention of shotguns and rifles.
28	(iv) Responses to common handgun, shotgun, and rifle
29	disarming techniques.
30	(F) Not less than two (2) hours on the topic of tactical
31	movement and maneuvering while armed. This topic shall
32	discuss the presentation and manipulation of a firearm
33	while:
34	(i) moving;
35	(ii) in hallways;
36	(iii) at room entrances;
37	(iv) in open spaces and venues; and
38	(v) in restricted spaces and areas.
39	(G) Not less than one (1) hour on the legal consequences of
10	a use of force action.
1 1	(H) Not less than one (1) hour on the topic of post-shooting
12	considerations and consequences. This topic shall consist



1	of the following subtopics:
2	(i) Psychological and emotional responses following a
3	shooting or use of force action.
4	(ii) The proper securing of a weapon following a
5	shooting.
6	(iii) The preservation of evidence following a shooting or
7	use of force action.
8	(iv) Safely identifying oneself to a law enforcement
9	officer while armed or immediately following a use of
10	force action.
1	(I) Not less than one (1) hour on the topic of school
12	shootings and active shooter incidents. This topic shall
13	evaluate and analyze past school shootings and active
14	shooter incidents for the purpose of:
15	(i) illustrating concepts discussed during the safety and
16	training course; and
17	(ii) critiquing ineffective or dangerous responses made
18	by other individuals during the course of a school
19	shooting or active shooter incident.
20	(J) Any other topic or remedial training:
21	(i) deemed appropriate or necessary by the course
22	instructor; or
23 24	(ii) necessitated by circumstances or conditions unique to
24	a specific school, teacher, or student.
25	(K) Not less than one (1) hour of tactical emergency
26	medical instruction.
27	Sec. 5. A teacher, school staff member, or school employee who
28	wishes to apply for a grant from the institute under section 3 of this
29	chapter must:
30	(1) have successfully completed the Minnesota multiphasic
31	personality inventory 2 (MMPI-II) prior to applying for a
32	grant described under section 3 of this chapter; and
33	(2) be able to provide proof of having completed the
34	Minnesota multiphasic personality inventory 2 (MMPI-II) to
35	the institute upon request.
36	Sec. 6. A teacher, school staff member, or school employee who:
37	(1) receives a grant from the institute under section 3 of this
38	chapter; and
39	(2) enrolls in a course of firearms instruction that meets the
10	requirements specified in section 4 of this chapter;
1 1	may complete the course of firearms instruction in parts or phases
12	if normitted by the course instructor



1	Sec. 7. (a) A teacher, school staff member, or school employee
2	who successfully completes a course of firearms instruction
3	described in section 4 of this chapter shall be awarded a certificate
4	of completion by the course instructor.
5	(b) A certificate of completion described under this section shall
6	display the following information:
7	(1) The course enrollee's name.
8	(2) The course instructor's name.
9	(3) The course instructor's handwritten signature.
10	(4) The date of course completion.
11	(5) Any other information deemed relevant or necessary by
12	the course instructor.
13	Sec. 8. A grant provided under section 3 of this chapter may not
14	be used to acquire firearms instruction that:
15	(1) fails to address each topic and subtopic described in

17	(2) is provided by any person lacking a valid National Rifle
18	Association certification.
19	Sec. 9. A teacher, school staff member, or school employee who:
20	(1) violates section 8 of this chapter;
21	(2) uses a grant provided under section 3 of this chapter for a
22	purpose not specified in section 4 of this chapter; or
23	(3) is unable to provide the institute with:
24	(A) a certificate of completion described in section 7(b) of
25	this chapter;
26	(B) proof that the teacher, school staff member, or school
27	employee is:
28	(i) currently enrolled; or
29	(ii) otherwise in the process of completing;
30	a course of firearms instruction that complies with section
31	4 of this chapter upon request; or
32	(C) proof of having completed the Minnesota multiphasic
33	personality inventory 2 (MMPI-II) upon request by the
34	institute;
35	must reimburse the institute in an amount equal to the amount of
36	any grant originally issued to the teacher, school staff member, or
37	school employee under this chapter.
38	Sec. 10. (a) The identity of a person who:
39	(1) has received a grant from the institute under section 3 of
40	this chapter; or
41	(2) has enrolled in, participated in, or completed the firearms
42	training described under section 4 of this chapter:



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- 2 (b) A charter school, nonpublic school, or school corporation may not disclose the identity of any person described in subsection
