Synopsis: Higher education co-op and internship programs. Establishes the Indiana cooperative education pilot program. Establishes the Indiana cooperative education pilot program fund.

Effective: July 1, 2015.

HOUSE BILL No. 1054

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning higher education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 21-16.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
2	A NEW ARTICLE TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
3	2015]:
4	ARTICLE 16.5. COOPERATIVE PROGRAMS
5	Chapter 1. Indiana Cooperative Education Pilot Program
6	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "cooperative education
7	program" means a partnership among a student, an eligible state
8	educational institution, and an employer located in Indiana that
9	formally integrates a student's academic study with work
10	experience with a cooperating Indiana employer that:
11	(1) alternates or combines periods of academic study and
12	work experience in appropriate fields as an integral part of
13	student education;
14	(2) provides students with compensation from the employer
15	in the form of wages or salaries for work performed;



1	(3) evaluates each participating student's performance in the
2	cooperative position, both from the perspective of the
3	student's eligible state educational institution and the
4	student's cooperative employer;
5	(4) provides participating students with academic credit from
6	the eligible state educational institution upon successful
7	completion of the student's cooperative education; and
8	(5) is part of an overall degree for which a percentage of the
9	total program acceptable by the commission involves
10	cooperative education.
11	Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "eligible state educational
12	institution" means a research intensive campus as defined in
13	IC 21-7-13-29.5.
14	Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "fund" refers to the Indiana
15	cooperative education pilot program fund established by section 8
16	of this chapter.
17	Sec. 4. As used in this chapter, "internship program" means a
18	partnership among a student, an eligible state educational
19	institution, and an employer located in Indiana that formally
20	integrates the student's academic study with work or community
21	experience that:
22	(1) offers internships of specified and definite duration; and
23	(2) evaluates each participating student's performance in the
24	internship position, both from the perspective of the student's
25	eligible state educational institution and the student's
26	internship employer.
27	Sec. 5. As used in this chapter, "program" refers to the Indiana
28	cooperative education pilot program established by section 6 of this
29	chapter.
30	Sec. 6. There is established an Indiana cooperative education
31	pilot program to be administered by the commission. The program
32	is established to promote and encourage cooperative education
33	programs or internship programs related to baccalaureate or
34	graduate degree programs at eligible state educational institutions
35	for the following purposes:
36	(1) To encourage Indiana students to stay in Indiana, and to
37	encourage out-of-state students at eligible state educational
38	institutions to enter the Indiana workforce by participating in
39	high quality academic programs that use cooperative
40	education programs or significant internship programs.
41	(2) To support the growth of Indiana businesses by providing

the businesses with Indiana's most talented students and

1	providing Indiana graduates job opportunities with growing
2	companies located in Indiana.
3	Sec. 7. (a) The commission may award to an eligible state
4	educational institution grants under this chapter if:
5	(1) the eligible state educational institution's proposal under
6	subsection (c) meets the goals of the program described in
7	section 6 of this chapter based on the criteria described in
8	subsection (b); and
9	(2) the eligible state educational institution either:
10	(A) has obtained a matching gift or grant; or
11	(B) has a commitment for a matching gift or grant.
12	The commission shall determine which proposals will receive
13	grants and the amount of each grant. The amount of a grant may
14	be in an amount not to exceed one hundred thousand dollars
15	(\$100,000). An eligible state educational institution may not receive
16	a grant for more than one (1) proposal in a particular state fiscal
17	year. The grants shall be paid from the fund.
18	(b) The commission shall consider the following criteria when
19	awarding grants under this chapter:
20	(1) The extent to which the proposal will keep Indiana
21	students in attendance at eligible state educational
22	institutions.
23	(2) The extent to which the proposal includes an internship
24	program or cooperative education program that provides
25	students wages, compensation, scholarships, or other forms of
26	tuition reimbursement by Indiana businesses.
27	(3) The extent to which the proposal will increase the number
28	of Indiana graduates who remain in Indiana and enter
29	Indiana's workforce.
30	(4) The quality of the program that is the subject of the
31	proposal and the extent to which additional resources will
32	enhance its quality.
33	(5) The extent to which the proposal is integrated with the
34	strengths of the regional economy.
35	(6) The extent to which the proposal facilitates the
36	development of high quality academic programs with a
37	cooperative education program or a significant internship
38	program at the eligible state educational institution.
39	(7) The extent to which the proposal is integrated with
40	supporting private companies to fill potential job growth.
41	(8) The amount of other public or private resources that will

also be available to facilitate the program described in the

2	(9) The extent to which the proposal will create additional
3	capacity in a high quality academic program with a
4	cooperative education program or significant internship
5	program.
6	(10) The extent to which the proposal is integrated with the
7	eligible state educational institution's mission.
8	(11) The extent to which the proposal meets a statewide
9	educational need at the undergraduate or graduate level.
10	(c) An eligible state educational institution may submit a
11	proposal to the commission for a grant under this chapter in a
12	manner prescribed by the commission. In addition to addressing
13	the criteria described in subsection (b), the proposal must include
14	detailed information regarding:
15	(1) the estimated amount of wages, compensation,
16	scholarships, or other forms of tuition reimbursement that
17	will be paid by an Indiana business to students participating
18	in the cooperative education program or internship program
19	under the proposal; and
20	(2) the estimated amount of time each student will work with
21	an Indiana business as part of the cooperative education
22	program or internship program under the proposal.
23	Sec. 8. (a) The Indiana cooperative education pilot program
24	fund is established to provide grants under this chapter. The fund
25	shall be administered by the commission.
26	(b) The fund consists of appropriations from the state general
27	fund and contributions from private sources.
28	(c) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from
29	money in the fund.
30	(d) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund not
31	currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same
32	manner as other public funds may be invested. Interest that
33	accrues from these investments shall be deposited in the fund.
34	(e) Except as provided in subsection (f), money in the fund at the
35	end of a particular fiscal year does not revert to the state general
36	fund but remains available to be used for providing grants under
37	this chapter.
38	(f) Money in the fund contributed by the state on the date this
39	article expires under IC 21-16.5-2-1 reverts to the state general
40	fund. Money in the fund contributed by private sources on the date
41	this article expires under IC 21-16.5-2-1 reverts to the donors in
42	proportion to the donation amount in a manner prescribed by the



1	commission.
2	Sec. 9. Any wages, compensation, scholarships, or other forms
3	of tuition reimbursement received by students participating in a
4	cooperative education program or internship program under this
5	chapter must not be considered as financial aid and must not be
6	used in determining awards under the provisions of IC 21-12-3,
7	IC 21-12-4, and IC 21-12-5.
8	Sec. 10. (a) An eligible state educational institution that receives
9	a grant under this chapter shall provide information requested by
10	the commission that is necessary to evaluate and improve the
11	program.
12	(b) Before November 1, 2016, and November 1 each year
13	thereafter, the commission shall submit a report to the general
14	assembly in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6. The report:
15	(1) must provide a summary of the grants awarded under this
16	chapter;
17	(2) must provide a summary of the program's progress in
18	meeting the program's purposes described in section 6 of this
19	chapter; and
20	(3) may make recommendations to the general assembly for
21	legislation to improve the program.
22	Chapter 2. Expiration of Article
23	Sec. 1. This article expires July 1, 2018.



COMMITTEE REPORT

Mr. Speaker: Your Committee on Education, to which was referred House Bill 1054, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the House with the recommendation that said bill be amended as follows:

Delete the title and insert the following:

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning higher education.

Page 3, delete lines 3 through 13, begin a new paragraph and insert: "Sec. 7. (a) The commission may award to an eligible state educational institution grants under this chapter if:

- (1) the eligible state educational institution's proposal under subsection (c) meets the goals of the program described in section 6 of this chapter based on the criteria described in subsection (b); and
- (2) the eligible state educational institution either:
 - (A) has obtained a matching gift or grant; or
 - (B) has a commitment for a matching gift or grant.

The commission shall determine which proposals will receive grants and the amount of each grant. The amount of a grant may be in an amount not to exceed one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000). An eligible state educational institution may not receive a grant for more than one (1) proposal in a particular state fiscal year. The grants shall be paid from the fund."

Page 4, delete lines 34 through 35, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"(f) Money in the fund contributed by the state on the date this article expires under IC 21-16.5-2-1 reverts to the state general fund. Money in the fund contributed by private sources on the date this article expires under IC 21-16.5-2-1 reverts to the donors in proportion to the donation amount in a manner prescribed by the commission."

Page 5, line 15, delete "July 1, 2017." and insert "July 1, 2018.". Page 5, delete lines 16 through 26.
