DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 16-46-7.

Synopsis: Sickle cell disease grant program. Adds specific requirements to the sickle cell program of the state department of health (department). Requires the department to establish sickle cell disease centers in various regions of Indiana.

Effective: July 1, 2015.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

The counseling provided must consist of the following:

27	including businesses, schools, and universities.
28	(c) The services required under subsection (b) must be provided

11	for educational programs concerning the disease.
12	(6) Adopt necessary rules.
13	SECTION 3. IC 16-46-7-9 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
14	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
15	1, 2015]: Sec. 9. The state department may do the following:
16	(1) Develop standards for determining eligibility for care and
17	treatment under the sickle cell disease program established
18	under this chapter.
19	(2) Assist in the development and expansion of programs for
20	the care and treatment of persons suffering from sickle cell
21	disease, including the following:
22	(A) Self administration.
23	(B) Prevention.
24	(C) Home care.
25	(D) Other medical procedures and techniques designed to
26	provide maximum control over sickling episodes typical of
27	the condition.
28	(3) Extend financial assistance to persons suffering from
29	sickle cell disease in obtaining chronic blood transfusions
30	hydroxyurea folic acid, and other effective agents to increase
31	the effectiveness of the funds appropriated to carry out this
32	chapter.
33	(4) Adopt rules necessary to carry out this chapter.
