DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 36-8.

Synopsis: Employment of veterans as public safety officers. Waives the maximum hiring age restrictions that apply to the appointment and hiring of police officers and firefighters for an individual who is a veteran of the armed forces and who meets certain requirements. Provides that an individual who is appointed as a police officer or a firefighter as the result of a waiver is not eligible to become a member of the 1977 police officers' and firefighters' pension and disability fund.

Effective: July 1, 2015.

HOUSE BILL No. 1630

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning pensions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 36-8-3.5-12, AS AMENDED BY P.L.99-2007,
2	SECTION 214, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2015]: Sec. 12. (a) Subject to IC 36-8-4.7, to
4	be appointed to the department, an applicant must be:
5	(1) a citizen of the United States;
6	(2) a high school graduate or equivalent; and
7	(3) at least twenty-one (21) years of age, but under thirty-six (36)
8	years of age.
9	However, the age requirements do not apply to a person who has been
10	previously employed as a member of the department.
11	(b) A person may not be appointed, reappointed, or reinstated if he
12	has a felony conviction on his record.
13	(c) Applications for appointment or reappointment to the
14	department must be filed with the commission. The applicant must
15	produce satisfactory proof of the date and place of his birth.



- (d) Applicants for appointment or reappointment to the department must pass the general aptitude test required under IC 36-8-3.2-3 or IC 36-8-3.2-3.5. The general aptitude test shall:
 - (1) reflect the essential functions of the job;
 - (2) be conducted according to procedures adopted by the commission; and
 - (3) be administered in a manner that reasonably accommodates the needs of applicants with a disability.

The results of the general aptitude test shall be filed with the commission. If the commission finds that the applicant lacks the proper qualifications, it shall reject the applicant.

- (e) The applicants shall then be rated on the selection criteria and testing methods adopted by the commission, which may include mental alertness, character, habits, and reputation. The commission shall adopt rules for grading the applicants, including the establishment of a passing score. The commission shall place the names of applicants with passing scores on an eligibility list by the order of their scores and shall certify the list to the safety board.
- (f) **This subsection is subject to IC 36-8-4.7.** If an applicant for original appointment reaches his thirty-sixth birthday, his name shall be removed from the eligibility list. Applicants remain on the list for two (2) years from the date of certification. After two (2) years a person may reapply as an applicant.
- (g) When a vacancy occurs in the department, the commission, upon a written request of the chief of the department, shall administer the physical agility test under IC 36-8-3.2-3 or IC 36-8-3.2-3.5 to the applicant having the highest score on the eligibility list. If the appointed applicant successfully completes the physical agility test, the applicant shall then be enrolled as a member of the department to fill the vacancy if:
 - (1) the applicant is still of good character; and
 - (2) the applicant passes the required examinations identified in IC 36-8-3.2-6 and IC 36-8-8-19.
- (h) All appointments are probationary for a period not to exceed one (1) year. If the commission finds, upon the recommendation of the department during the probationary period, that the conduct or capacity of the probationary member is not satisfactory, the commission shall notify him in writing that he is being reprimanded, that he is being suspended, or that he will not receive a permanent appointment. If a member is notified that he will not receive a permanent appointment, his employment immediately ceases. Otherwise, at the expiration of the probationary period the member is considered regularly employed.

 - (2) The United States Navy.
 - (3) The United States Air Force.

2	Sec. 4. As used in this chapter, "veteran" means an individual
3	who has served or is serving in the armed forces.
4	Sec. 5. (a) Notwithstanding any contrary law, an appointing
5	authority shall waive any age restriction that applies to the
6	appointment and hiring of an individual as:
7	(1) a member of the police department; or
8	(2) a member of the fire department;
9	if the individual meets the requirements of subsection (b).
10	(b) An individual who meets all of the following requirements is
11	entitled to the waiver described in subsection (a):
12	(1) On the date the individual applies to be appointed and
13	hired as:
14	(A) a member of the police department; or
15	(B) a member of the fire department;

 (d) A police officer or firefighter with twenty (20) years of service does not become a member of the 1977 fund and is not covered by this chapter, if the police officer or firefighter:
 - (1) was hired before May 1, 1977;
 - (2) did not convert under IC 19-1-17.8-7 or IC 19-1-36.5-7 (both of which were repealed September 1, 1981); and
 - (3) is rehired after April 30, 1977, by the same employer.
- (e) A police officer or firefighter does not become a member of the 1977 fund and is not covered by this chapter if the police officer or firefighter:
 - (1) was hired before May 1, 1977;
 - (2) did not convert under IC 19-1-17.8-7 or IC 19-1-36.5-7 (both of which were repealed September 1, 1981);
 - (3) was rehired after April 30, 1977, but before February 1, 1979; and
 - (4) was made, before February 1, 1979, a member of a 1925, 1937, or 1953 fund.
- (f) A police officer or firefighter does not become a member of the 1977 fund and is not covered by this chapter if the police officer or firefighter:
 - (1) was hired by the police or fire department of a unit before May 1, 1977;
 - (2) did not convert under IC 19-1-17.8-7 or IC 19-1-36.5-7 (both of which were repealed September 1, 1981);
 - (3) is rehired by the police or fire department of another unit after December 31, 1981; and
- (4) is made, by the fiscal body of the other unit after December 31, 1981, a member of a 1925, 1937, or 1953 fund of the other unit.



1	If the police officer or firefighter is made a member of a 1925, 1937, or
2	1953 fund, the police officer or firefighter is entitled to receive credit
3	for all the police officer's or firefighter's years of service, including
4	years before January 1, 1982.
5	(g) As used in this subsection, "emergency medical services" and
6	"emergency medical technician" have the meanings set forth ir
7	IC 16-18-2-110 and IC 16-18-2-112. A firefighter who:
8	(1) is employed by a unit that is participating in the 1977 fund;
9	(2) was employed as an emergency medical technician by a
10	political subdivision wholly or partially within the department's
11	jurisdiction;
12	(3) was a member of the public employees' retirement fund during
13	the employment described in subdivision (2); and

15	or firefighter provides law enforcement services or fire protection
16	services for an entity in a consolidated city;

18	enforcement department or fire department of a consolidated city;

20	(3) after the consolidation, the police officer or firefighter
21	becomes an employee of the consolidated law enforcement
22	department or the consolidated fire department under
23	IC 8-22-3-11.6;
24	the police officer or firefighter is a member of the 1977 fund without
25	meeting the requirements under sections 19 and 21 of this chapter.
26	(m) A police officer or firefighter who is a member of the 1977 fund
27	under subsection (k) or (l) may not be:
28	(1) retired for purposes of section 10 of this chapter; or
29	(2) disabled for purposes of section 12 of this chapter;
30	solely because of a change in employer under the consolidation.
31	(n) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter and subject
32	to subsection (o), a police officer or firefighter who:
33	(1) is an active member of the 1977 fund with an employer that
34	participates in the 1977 fund;
35	(2) separates from that employer; and
36	(3) not later than one hundred eighty (180) days after the date of
37	the separation described in subdivision (2), becomes employed as
38	a full-time police officer or firefighter with a second employer
39	that participates in the 1977 fund;
40	is a member of the 1977 fund without meeting for a second time the
41	age limitation under subsection (a) and the requirements under sections

(o) The one hundred eighty (180) day limitation described in subsection (n)(3) does not apply to a member of the 1977 fund who is eligible for reinstatement under IC 36-8-4-11.
