2	Fruechtenicht and honoring him for his many years of public service to
3	the State of Indiana.
4	Whereas, Thomas E. Fruechtenicht, a lifelong Hoosier,
5	dedicated his life to public service here in Indiana;
6	Whereas, On April 10, 2015, Tom passed away at the age
7	of 75 after a courageous battle with cancer;
8	Whereas, Born in Fort Wayne, Indiana, on April 8, 1940,
9	Tom attended South Side High School where he lettered in
10	track, excelled at football, and was a distinguished member of
11	the National Honor Society;
12	Whereas, Following high school, Tom enrolled at Indiana
13	University Bloomington where he obtained a bachelor's degree
14	in Business Administration in 1962;
15	Whereas, While at Indiana University, Tom was an officer
16	in the Sigma Nu fraternity, an active member of the
17	professional business fraternity Alpha Kappa Psi, and rode
18	twice in the Little 500 bike race;

20	Whereas, In 1965, Tom graduated from the Indiana
21	University School of Law with his juris doctor;

1	Whereas, Tom began practicing law in Fort Wayne and was
2	named Justice of the Peace for Wayne Township, Allen County,
3	where he served for four years, and was subsequently
4	appointed to the Allen County prosecutor's association where
5	he served in the juvenile and felony divisions for two years;
6	Whereas, In 1972, Tom was elected to the Indiana State
7	House of Representatives and was re-elected for four
8	consecutive terms;
9	Whereas, As an Indiana State Representative, Tom was
10	elected House Minority Caucus Chairman, served as Chairman
11	of the House Public Policy Committee, and was a member of
12	both the Courts & Criminal Code and Judiciary committees;
13	Whereas, Tom was admired on both sides of the aisle for
14	his honesty, integrity, and ability to get things done;
15	Whereas, After serving 10 years as a State Representative,
16	in 1983 Tom formed a new law firm with former State Senator
17	William Soards and John Barnett, Jr., and began working in
18	government relations as a registered lobbyist;
19	Whereas, During this time, Tom represented numerous
20	clients before the Indiana General Assembly and various
21	administrative agencies, including large corporations, small
22	privately owned companies, and non-profit associations;
23	Whereas, In 2004, Tom joined Bose Public Affairs Group
24	as Senior Vice President and in-house counsel specializing in
25	legislative affairs, retiring in 2011;
26	Whereas, Tom was a member of the Indiana State Bar
27	Association where he served as Chairman of the Young
28	Lawver's section and as a member of the Roard of Managers:



1	Whereas, Tom was also a member of the Indianapolis and
2	American Bar Associations, a Master Fellow of the Indiana Bar
3	Foundation, and a member of the Governmental Affairs Society
4	of Indiana, Indiana Athletic Club, Columbia Club, Indiana
5	Historical Society, and the Indianapolis Museum of Art;
6	Whereas, Governor Evan Bayh awarded Tom the Sagamore
7	of the Wabash, the highest civilian honor offered by the
8	Governor of Indiana;
9	Whereas, Tom was always a steadfast and loyal friend who
10	cared deeply for people and went out of his way to lend a
11	helping hand, seeking nothing in return;
12	Whereas, Tom is survived by his wife of 33 years, Jane
13	Fruechtenicht; his daughter Beth and son Robert; step-children
14	Stewart, Brian, Scot, Matthew, Gregg, Shondell, and AJ; and
15	his grandchildren Caitlin, Stewart, Kaitlin, K.C., Maddie,
16	Katie, Caroline, Chandler, Regina, Mary Grace, Samantha,
17	Meredith, Elizabeth, Brigitte, Cole, and Olivia; and his nieces
18	and nephews, all of whom he loved dearly;
19	Whereas, Tom is predeceased by his parents Walter and
20	Clara Fruechtenicht, and his sister Carole Meikle; and
21	Whereas, It is fitting that the Indiana General Assembly
22	gives special recognition to Tom's lifelong commitment and
23	substantial contributions to the State of Indiana: Therefore,
24	Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly
25	of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:
