CRIME: Requests that the North Louisiana Criminalistics Laboratory be named in honor of Charles Rex Scott

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request that the North Louisiana Criminalistics Laboratory Commission
3	designate the new North Louisiana Criminalistics Laboratory as the "Charles Rex
4	Scott North Louisiana Criminalistics Laboratory" in honor of Mr. Charles Rex Scott
5	and his legacy of service to the people of Caddo Parish.
6	WHEREAS, Act No. 168 of the 1981 Regular Legislative Session created the North
7	Louisiana Criminalistics Laboratory Commission to maintain and operate the North
8	Louisiana Criminalistics Laboratory domiciled in Caddo Parish; and
9	WHEREAS, the commission and laboratory serve the north Louisiana parishes of
10	Avoyelles, Bienville, Bossier, Caddo, Claiborne, DeSoto, Lincoln, Natchitoches, Red River,
11	Sabine, Webster, Caldwell, Concordia, East Carroll, Franklin, Grant, Jackson, LaSalle,
12	Madison, Morehouse, Ouachita, Rapides, Richland, Tensas, Union, Vernon, West Carroll,
13	and Winn, for the purpose of crime detection, prevention, investigation, and other related
14	activities in connection with criminal investigations; and
15	WHEREAS, on November 15, 2013, Governor Bobby Jindal and local officials
16	marked the groundbreaking of the new North Louisiana Criminalistics Laboratory in Caddo
17	Parish; and

1	WHEREAS, the facility will increase forensic support to law enforcement partners
2	in communities across North Louisiana and allow experts to process evidence more
3	efficiently so that crimes can be solved faster; and
4	WHEREAS, the state committed \$24 million in capital outlay funding to build the
5	new crime lab; and
6	WHEREAS, news media have reported that the new facility will be large enough to
7	meet the evidence analysis demand of North Louisiana and will also provide hands-on
8	learning experience for LSU-Health forensic students, who will be able to work in the new
9	facility and access new forensic technology. The new building will be built on property that
10	is part of the LSU-Health Shreveport campus and will be used as a teaching facility for areas
11	of Forensic Pathology through LSU-Health, as well as graduate studies programs in Forensic
12	Science in its School of Allied Health; and
13	WHEREAS, Charles Rex Scott has served the people of Caddo Parish and the state
14	of Louisiana as a Caddo Parish district judge for thirty years and as the Caddo Parish District
15	Attorney for almost seven years; and
16	WHEREAS, Charles Rex Scott attended Northwestern State University and obtained
17	his juris doctorate from LSU School of Law; he served as an assistant city attorney and
18	special assistant district attorney for seven years, from 1973 until 1980; and
19	WHEREAS, Charles Rex Scott devoted his life to the service of law and the people
20	of Caddo Parish; and
21	WHEREAS, Charles Rex Scott worked tirelessly for the funding of a new crime lab
22	in Caddo Parish and was instrumental in lowering the jail population; and
23	WHEREAS, Charles Rex Scott served dutifully as the Chairman of the North
24	Louisiana Criminalistics Laboratory Commission; and
25	WHEREAS, Mr. Scott was quoted at the groundbreaking of the new crime lab
26	facility as saying, "The North Louisiana Crime Lab has consistently maintained a high level
27	of accreditation, and this new facility will build on our current ability to protect our children
28	and communities and ensure justice is swiftly served. In order to maintain a healthy
29	economy and attract safety-conscious businesses, we need to make our area as safe as
30	possible. This new facility will help all of our law enforcement officials do just that."; and
