



1           WHEREAS, forty-two percent of women have experienced physical or sexual  
2 violence from a partner with only ten percent of these women reporting their partner; and

3           WHEREAS, organizations like the Louisiana Foundation Against Sexual Assault  
4 (LaFASA), the Rape, Abuse & Incest National Network (RAINN), and Sexual Trauma  
5 Awareness & Response (STAR) exist to address sexual abuse concerns in this state and offer  
6 resources to survivors; and

7           WHEREAS, such sexual abuse initiatives provide support services to survivors and  
8 statewide sexual assault crisis centers through education, professional training, technical  
9 assistance, and community engagement; and

10          WHEREAS, the Department of Children and Family Services has implemented a  
11 hotline for child abuse and neglect, which includes reports of sexual trafficking; and

12          WHEREAS, expansion of such services could be beneficial to Louisiana residents  
13 who are currently facing or have faced sexual abuse, reported or otherwise; and

14          WHEREAS, the Department of Children and Family Services should research and  
15 consider the implementation of a 233 helpline as an additional resource for sexual abuse  
16 victims in this state.

17          THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby  
18 urge and request the Department of Children and Family Services to study the feasibility of  
19 implementing a 233 helpline as an additional resource for sexual abuse victims in this state  
20 and submit its findings in the form of a written report by February 1, 2025 to the House and  
21 Senate committees on health and welfare.

22          BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report shall include information about means  
23 of funding for creating a helpline and determining costs for a marketing campaign to boost  
24 awareness of the 233 helpline initiative.

25          BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the  
26 secretary of the Department of Children and Family Services.
