27 28 29 30 31 32	This amendment changes the title and strikes most of the bill, retaining those sections that include references to aggravated sex trafficking, sex trafficking and prostitution of a minor or a person with a disability as crimes for which an enhanced charge applies. The amendment also retains the changes to the Child and Family Services and Child Protection Act. The amendment adds sexual exploitation of a minor, sex trafficking and aggravated sex trafficking to the list of aggravating factors in the child welfare laws.
