2 **Crimes – Restricted Firearm Ammunition – Prohibition on Possession and**
3 **Use**

4 FOR the purpose of making it a misdemeanor to possess or use certain firearm
5 ammunition during and in relation to the commission of a crime; establishing
6 certain penalties; defining a certain term; and generally relating to prohibitions
7 on the possession and use of restricted firearm ammunition.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Criminal Law**

16 **4–110.**

17 **(A) IN THIS SECTION, “RESTRICTED FIREARM AMMUNITION” MEANS A**
18 **CARTRIDGE, A SHELL, OR ANY OTHER DEVICE THAT IS:**

1 **(1) INTENDED FOR USE IN A FIREARM; AND**

2 **(2) (I) COATED WITH OR CONTAINING, IN WHOLE OR IN PART,**
3 **POLYTETRAFLUORETHYLENE OR A SIMILAR PRODUCT;**

4 **(II) COATED WITH A PLASTIC SUBSTANCE AND CONTAINING**
5 **A CORE OTHER THAN LEAD OR LEAD ALLOY; OR**

6 **(III) ENTIRELY COMPOSED OF A METAL OR METAL ALLOY**
7 **OTHER THAN LEAD.**

8 **(B) A PERSON MAY NOT POSSESS OR USE RESTRICTED FIREARM**
9 **AMMUNITION DURING AND IN RELATION TO THE COMMISSION OF A CRIME.**

10 **(C) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A**
11 **MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT**
12 **EXCEEDING 5 YEARS OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 OR BOTH.**

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
14 October 1, 2013.
