By Mr. Peterson of Grafton, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3272) of George N. Peterson, Jr. and others relative to the terms of firearm licenses and exempting certain persons from paying firearms license renewal fees. Public Safety and Homeland Security.

**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

**In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen**

An Act relative to the term of firearm licenses.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 129B of Chapter 140 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010  
2 Official Edition, shall be amended by striking paragraph (9) in lines 170 to 186 and replacing it  
3 with the following:-

4 (9) A firearm identification card shall be valid unless revoked or suspended.

5 SECTION 2. Section 131 of Chapter 140 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010  
6 Official Edition, shall be amended by striking in paragraph (i) in lines 231 to 245 the words “A  
7 license to carry or possess firearms shall be valid, unless revoked or suspended, for a period of  
8 not more than 6 years from the date of issue and shall expire on the anniversary of the licensee's  
9 date of birth occurring not less than 5 years but not more than 6 years from the date of issue,  
10 except that if the licensee applied for renewal before the license expired, the license shall remain  
11 valid for a period of 90 days beyond the stated expiration date on the license, unless the  
12 application for renewal is denied if the licensee is on active duty with the armed forces of the  
13 United States on the expiration date of his license, the license shall remain valid until the  
14 licensee is released from active duty and for a period of not less than 90 days following such  
15 release. Any renewal thereof shall expire on the anniversary of the licensee's date of birth  
16 occurring not less than 5 years but not more than 6 years from the effective date of such license.  
17 Any license issued to an applicant born on February 29 shall expire on March 1.” and replacing it  
18 with the following:-

19 license to carry or possess firearms shall be valid unless revoked or suspended.

20 SECTION 3. Section 131 of Chapter 140 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010  
21 Official Edition, shall be further amended by striking in paragraph (i) in lines 271 to 274 the  
22 following:-

23 Any person over the age of 70 and any law enforcement officer applying for a license to  
24 carry firearms through his employing agency shall be exempt from the requirement of paying a  
25 renewal fee for a Class A or Class B license to carry.
