#### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to non-resident firearm licensing.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 131F of Chapter 140 of the General Law is hereby amended by inserting a new
- 2 paragraph:-
- 3 Any person who was previously a resident of the Commonwealth and held a License to
- 4 Carry Firearms in good standing under section131 that:
- 5 1. Currently owns property that is utilized by them as a personal residence for a
- 6 minimum of thirty days in a calendar year, or
- 7 2. Currently maintains a vehicle registered in the Commonwealth, or
- 8 3. Currently attends school in the Commonwealth, or

- 9 4. Currently owns a business within the Commonwealth
- Shall be entitled to apply for a license to carry firearms under section 131.
