.7	Subdivision 1. Failure to report; gross misdemeanor. A person who fails to report a
.8	stolen or lost firearm within 14 days of discovery of the theft or loss may be punished as

.10	Subd. 2. Penalty. (a) A person who violates this section is guilty of a petty misdemeanor.
.11	(b) A person who violates this section a second time is guilty of a misdemeanor.
.12	(c) A person who violates this section a third or subsequent time is guilty of a gross

.14	Subd. 3. Duty to report. A person shall report a stolen or lost firearm to the chief of
