## AN ACT

To amend chapter 197, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to hospital patient status notice requirements.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 197, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 197.130, to read as follows:

197.130. 1. All hospitals licensed under this chapter shall require admission staff to provide written notice to each patient when the patient is admitted to the hospital under observational status:

- (1) During the intake process;
- (2) At any time the patient's status changes; and
- 6 **(3) Upon discharge.**

- Upon discharge the hospital admission staff shall provide written notice to the patient regarding the duration of the patient's inpatient status, observational status, or both.
  - 2. Each written notice shall include:
- (1) A statement regarding whether the patient is being admitted to the hospital under inpatient status or observational status;
- (2) A statement that observation status may affect the patient's Medicare, MO HealthNet, or private insurance coverage for hospital services including medications and pharmaceutical supplies and for home- and community-based care or rehabilitative services at a skilled nursing facility if needed upon discharge from the hospital; and
- (3) A recommendation that the patient contact his or her health insurance provider to better understand the implications of a patient's placement in observation status.

19 The department of health and senior services shall promulgate rules to 20 implement the provisions of this section and shall develop an acknowledgment form to 21 meet the written notice requirements of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this 22 section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions 23 of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are 24 25 nonseverable, and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to 26 chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are 27 subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule 28 proposed or adopted after August 28, 2015, shall be invalid and void.
