4	year thereafter, upon graduation from high school, pupils in		
5	public schools and charter schools shall have received		
6	mental health awareness training given any time during a		
7	pupil's four years of high school.		
8	2. Beginning in school year 2022-23, any public school		
9	or charter school serving grades nine through twelve shall		
10	provide enrolled students instruction in mental health		
11	awareness. Students with disabilities may participate to		
12	the extent appropriate as determined by the provisions of		
13	the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act or Section		
14	504 of the Rehabilitation Act. Instruction shall be		
15	included in the district's existing health or physical		
16	education curriculum. Instruction shall be based on a		
17	program established by the department of elementary and		
18	secondary education.		
19	3. The department of elementary and secondary		
20	education shall promulgate rules to develop a model		
21	curriculum to be used by school districts to provide the		
22	instruction required by this section. Any rule or portion		
23	of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that		
24	is created under the authority delegated in this section		
25	shall become effective only if it complies with and is		
26	subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if		

27 applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 28 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay 29 the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are 30 31 subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of 32 rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2022, shall be invalid and void."; and 33 34 Further amend the title and enacting clause accordingly.
