AN ACT

To repeal sections 571.101 and 571.205, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to concealed carry permits, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 571.101 and 571.205, RSMo, are
2 repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be
3 known as sections 571.101 and 571.205, to read as follows:

571.101. 1. All applicants for concealed carry
2 permits issued pursuant to subsection 7 of this section must
3 satisfy the requirements of sections 571.101 to 571.121. If
4 the said applicant can show qualification as provided by
5 sections 571.101 to 571.121, the county or city sheriff
6 shall issue a concealed carry permit authorizing the
7 carrying of a concealed firearm on or about the applicant's
8 person or within a vehicle. A concealed carry permit shall
9 be valid from the date of issuance or renewal until five
10 years from the last day of the month in which the permit was
11 issued or renewed. The concealed carry permit is valid
12 throughout this state. Although the permit is considered
13 valid in the state, a person who fails to renew his or her
14 permit within five years from the date of issuance or
15 renewal shall not be eligible for an exception to a National
16 Instant Criminal Background Check under federal regulations
17 currently codified under 27 CFR 478.102(d), relating to the
18 transfer, sale, or delivery of firearms from licensed

19 dealers. A concealed carry endorsement issued prior to
20 August 28, 2013, shall continue from the date of issuance or
21 renewal until three years from the last day of the month in
22 which the endorsement was issued or renewed to authorize the
23 carrying of a concealed firearm on or about the applicant's
24 person or within a vehicle in the same manner as a concealed
25 carry permit issued under subsection 7 of this section on or
26 after August 28, 2013.

27 2. A concealed carry permit issued pursuant to
28 subsection 7 of this section shall be issued by the sheriff
29 or his or her designee of the county or city in which the
30 applicant resides, if the applicant:

31 (1) Is at least nineteen years of age, is a citizen or
32 permanent resident of the United States and either:

33 (a) Has assumed residency in this state; or

34 (b) Is a member of the Armed Forces stationed in
35 Missouri, or the spouse of such member of the military;

36 (2) Is at least nineteen years of age, or is at least
37 eighteen years of age and a member of the United States
38 Armed Forces or honorably discharged from the United States
39 Armed Forces, and is a citizen of the United States and
40 either:

41 (a) Has assumed residency in this state;

42 (b) Is a member of the Armed Forces stationed in
43 Missouri; or

44 (c) The spouse of such member of the military
45 stationed in Missouri and nineteen years of age;

46 (3) Has not [pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo
47 contendere or] been convicted of a crime punishable by
48 imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under the laws of
49 any state or of the United States other than a crime
50 classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and

51 punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less
52 that does not involve an explosive weapon, firearm, firearm
53 silencer or gas gun;

54 (4) Has not been convicted of[, pled guilty to or
55 entered a plea of nolo contendere to] one or more
56 misdemeanor offenses involving crimes of violence within a
57 five-year period immediately preceding application for a
58 concealed carry permit or if the applicant has not been
59 convicted of two or more misdemeanor offenses involving
60 driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or
61 drugs or the possession or abuse of a controlled substance
62 within a five-year period immediately preceding application
63 for a concealed carry permit;

64 (5) Is not a fugitive from justice or currently
65 charged in an information or indictment with the commission
66 of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding
67 one year under the laws of any state of the United States
68 other than a crime classified as a misdemeanor under the
69 laws of any state and punishable by a term of imprisonment
70 of two years or less that does not involve an explosive
71 weapon, firearm, firearm silencer, or gas gun;

72 (6) Has not been discharged under dishonorable
73 conditions from the United States Armed Forces;

74 (7) Has not engaged in a pattern of behavior,
75 documented in public or closed records, that causes the
76 sheriff to have a reasonable belief that the applicant
77 presents a danger to himself or others;

78 (8) Is not adjudged mentally incompetent at the time
79 of application or for five years prior to application, or
80 has not been committed to a mental health facility, as
81 defined in section 632.005, or a similar institution located

82 in another state following a hearing at which the defendant
83 was represented by counsel or a representative;

84 (9) Submits a completed application for a permit as
85 described in subsection 3 of this section;

86 (10) Submits an affidavit attesting that the applicant
87 complies with the concealed carry safety training
88 requirement pursuant to subsections 1 and 2 of section
89 571.111;

90 (11) Is not the respondent of a valid full order of
91 protection which is still in effect;

92 (12) Is not otherwise prohibited from possessing a
93 firearm under section 571.070 or 18 U.S.C. Section 922(g).

94 3. The application for a concealed carry permit issued
95 by the sheriff of the county of the applicant's residence
96 shall contain only the following information:

97 (1) The applicant's name, address, telephone number,
98 gender, date and place of birth, and, if the applicant is
99 not a United States citizen, the applicant's country of
100 citizenship and any alien or admission number issued by the
101 Federal Bureau of Customs and Immigration Enforcement or any
102 successor agency;

103 (2) An affirmation that the applicant has assumed
104 residency in Missouri or is a member of the Armed Forces
105 stationed in Missouri or the spouse of such a member of the
106 Armed Forces and is a citizen or permanent resident of the
107 United States;

108 (3) An affirmation that the applicant is at least
109 nineteen years of age or is eighteen years of age or older
110 and a member of the United States Armed Forces or honorably
111 discharged from the United States Armed Forces;

112 (4) An affirmation that the applicant has not [pled
113 guilty to or] been convicted of a crime punishable by

114 imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under the laws of
115 any state or of the United States other than a crime
116 classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and
117 punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less
118 that does not involve an explosive weapon, firearm, firearm
119 silencer, or gas gun;

120 (5) An affirmation that the applicant has not been
121 convicted of[, pled guilty to, or entered a plea of nolo
122 contendere to] one or more misdemeanor offenses involving
123 crimes of violence within a five-year period immediately
124 preceding application for a permit or if the applicant has
125 not been convicted of two or more misdemeanor offenses
126 involving driving while under the influence of intoxicating
127 liquor or drugs or the possession or abuse of a controlled
128 substance within a five-year period immediately preceding
129 application for a permit;

130 (6) An affirmation that the applicant is not a
131 fugitive from justice or currently charged in an information
132 or indictment with the commission of a crime punishable by
133 imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under the laws of
134 any state or of the United States other than a crime
135 classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and
136 punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less
137 that does not involve an explosive weapon, firearm, firearm
138 silencer or gas gun;

139 (7) An affirmation that the applicant has not been
140 discharged under dishonorable conditions from the United
141 States Armed Forces;

142 (8) An affirmation that the applicant is not adjudged
143 mentally incompetent at the time of application or for five
144 years prior to application, or has not been committed to a
145 mental health facility, as defined in section 632.005, or a

146 similar institution located in another state, except that a
147 person whose release or discharge from a facility in this
148 state pursuant to chapter 632, or a similar discharge from a
149 facility in another state, occurred more than five years ago
150 without subsequent recommitment may apply;

151 (9) An affirmation that the applicant has received
152 firearms safety training that meets the standards of
153 applicant firearms safety training defined in subsection 1
154 or 2 of section 571.111;

155 (10) An affirmation that the applicant, to the
156 applicant's best knowledge and belief, is not the respondent
157 of a valid full order of protection which is still in effect;

158 (11) A conspicuous warning that false statements made
159 by the applicant will result in prosecution for perjury
160 pursuant to the laws of the state of Missouri; and

161 (12) A government-issued photo identification. This
162 photograph shall not be included on the permit and shall
163 only be used to verify the person's identity for permit
164 renewal, or for the issuance of a new permit due to change
165 of address, or for a lost or destroyed permit.

166 4. An application for a concealed carry permit shall
167 be made to the sheriff of the county or any city not within
168 a county in which the applicant resides. An application
169 shall be filed in writing, signed under oath and under the
170 penalties of perjury, and shall state whether the applicant
171 complies with each of the requirements specified in
172 subsection 2 of this section. In addition to the completed
173 application, the applicant for a concealed carry permit must
174 also submit the following:

175 (1) A photocopy of a firearms safety training
176 certificate of completion or other evidence of completion of

177 a firearms safety training course that meets the standards
178 established in subsection 1 or 2 of section 571.111; and

179 (2) A nonrefundable permit fee as provided by
180 subsection 11 or 12 of this section.

181 5. (1) Before an application for a concealed carry
182 permit is approved, the sheriff shall make only such
183 inquiries as he or she deems necessary into the accuracy of
184 the statements made in the application. The sheriff may
185 require that the applicant display a Missouri driver's
186 license or nondriver's license or military identification
187 and orders showing the person being stationed in Missouri.
188 In order to determine the applicant's suitability for a
189 concealed carry permit, the applicant shall be
190 fingerprinted. No other biometric data shall be collected
191 from the applicant. The sheriff shall conduct an inquiry of
192 the National Instant Criminal Background Check System within
193 three working days after submission of the properly
194 completed application for a concealed carry permit. If no
195 disqualifying record is identified by these checks at the
196 state level, the fingerprints shall be forwarded to the
197 Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal
198 history record check. Upon receipt of the completed report
199 from the National Instant Criminal Background Check System
200 and the response from the Federal Bureau of Investigation
201 national criminal history record check, the sheriff shall
202 examine the results and, if no disqualifying information is
203 identified, shall issue a concealed carry permit within
204 three working days.

205 (2) In the event the report from the National Instant
206 Criminal Background Check System and the response from the
207 Federal Bureau of Investigation national criminal history
208 record check prescribed by subdivision (1) of this

209 subsection are not completed within forty-five calendar days
210 and no disqualifying information concerning the applicant
211 has otherwise come to the sheriff's attention, the sheriff
212 shall issue a provisional permit, clearly designated on the
213 certificate as such, which the applicant shall sign in the
214 presence of the sheriff or the sheriff's designee. This
215 permit, when carried with a valid Missouri driver's or
216 nondriver's license or a valid military identification,
217 shall permit the applicant to exercise the same rights in
218 accordance with the same conditions as pertain to a
219 concealed carry permit issued under this section, provided
220 that it shall not serve as an alternative to an national
221 instant criminal background check required by 18 U.S.C.
222 Section 922(t). The provisional permit shall remain valid
223 until such time as the sheriff either issues or denies the
224 certificate of qualification under subsection 6 or 7 of this
225 section. The sheriff shall revoke a provisional permit
226 issued under this subsection within twenty-four hours of
227 receipt of any report that identifies a disqualifying
228 record, and shall notify the concealed carry permit system
229 established under subsection 5 of section 650.350. The
230 revocation of a provisional permit issued under this section
231 shall be proscribed in a manner consistent to the denial and
232 review of an application under subsection 6 of this section.

233 6. The sheriff may refuse to approve an application
234 for a concealed carry permit if he or she determines that
235 any of the requirements specified in subsection 2 of this
236 section have not been met, or if he or she has a substantial
237 and demonstrable reason to believe that the applicant has
238 rendered a false statement regarding any of the provisions
239 of sections 571.101 to 571.121. If the applicant is found
240 to be ineligible, the sheriff is required to deny the

241 application, and notify the applicant in writing, stating
242 the grounds for denial and informing the applicant of the
243 right to submit, within thirty days, any additional
244 documentation relating to the grounds of the denial. Upon
245 receiving any additional documentation, the sheriff shall
246 reconsider his or her decision and inform the applicant
247 within thirty days of the result of the reconsideration.
248 The applicant shall further be informed in writing of the
249 right to appeal the denial pursuant to subsections 2, 3, 4,
250 and 5 of section 571.114. After two additional reviews and
251 denials by the sheriff, the person submitting the
252 application shall appeal the denial pursuant to subsections
253 2, 3, 4, and 5 of section 571.114.

254 7. If the application is approved, the sheriff shall
255 issue a concealed carry permit to the applicant within a
256 period not to exceed three working days after his or her
257 approval of the application. The applicant shall sign the
258 concealed carry permit in the presence of the sheriff or his
259 or her designee.

260 8. The concealed carry permit shall specify only the
261 following information:

- 262 (1) Name, address, date of birth, gender, height,
263 weight, color of hair, color of eyes, and signature of the
264 permit holder;
- 265 (2) The signature of the sheriff issuing the permit;
- 266 (3) The date of issuance; and
- 267 (4) The expiration date.

268 The permit shall be no larger than two and one-eighth inches
269 wide by three and three-eighths inches long and shall be of
270 a uniform style prescribed by the department of public
271 safety. The permit shall also be assigned a concealed carry

272 permit system county code and shall be stored in sequential
273 number.

274 9. (1) The sheriff shall keep a record of all
275 applications for a concealed carry permit or a provisional
276 permit and his or her action thereon. Any record of an
277 application that is incomplete or denied for any reason
278 shall be kept for a period not to exceed one year. Any
279 record of an application that was approved shall be kept for
280 a period of one year after the expiration and nonrenewal of
281 the permit.

282 (2) The sheriff shall report the issuance of a
283 concealed carry permit or provisional permit to the
284 concealed carry permit system. All information on any such
285 permit that is protected information on any driver's or
286 nondriver's license shall have the same personal protection
287 for purposes of sections 571.101 to 571.121. An applicant's
288 status as a holder of a concealed carry permit, provisional
289 permit, or a concealed carry endorsement issued prior to
290 August 28, 2013, shall not be public information and shall
291 be considered personal protected information. Information
292 retained in the concealed carry permit system under this
293 subsection shall not be distributed to any federal, state,
294 or private entities and shall only be made available for a
295 single entry query of an individual in the event the
296 individual is a subject of interest in an active criminal
297 investigation or is arrested for a crime. A sheriff may
298 access the concealed carry permit system for administrative
299 purposes to issue a permit, verify the accuracy of permit
300 holder information, change the name or address of a permit
301 holder, suspend or revoke a permit, cancel an expired
302 permit, or cancel a permit upon receipt of a certified death
303 certificate for the permit holder. Any person who violates

304 the provisions of this subdivision by disclosing protected
305 information shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

306 10. Information regarding any holder of a concealed
307 carry permit, or a concealed carry endorsement issued prior
308 to August 28, 2013, is a closed record. No bulk download or
309 batch data shall be distributed to any federal, state, or
310 private entity, except to MoSMART or a designee thereof.
311 Any state agency that has retained any documents or records,
312 including fingerprint records provided by an applicant for a
313 concealed carry endorsement prior to August 28, 2013, shall
314 destroy such documents or records, upon successful issuance
315 of a permit.

316 11. For processing an application for a concealed
317 carry permit pursuant to sections 571.101 to 571.121, the
318 sheriff in each county shall charge a nonrefundable fee not
319 to exceed one hundred dollars which shall be paid to the
320 treasury of the county to the credit of the sheriff's
321 revolving fund. This fee shall include the cost to
322 reimburse the Missouri state highway patrol for the costs of
323 fingerprinting and criminal background checks. An
324 additional fee shall be added to each credit card, debit
325 card, or other electronic transaction equal to the charge
326 paid by the state or the applicant for the use of the credit
327 card, debit card, or other electronic payment method by the
328 applicant.

329 12. For processing a renewal for a concealed carry
330 permit pursuant to sections 571.101 to 571.121, the sheriff
331 in each county shall charge a nonrefundable fee not to
332 exceed fifty dollars which shall be paid to the treasury of
333 the county to the credit of the sheriff's revolving fund.

334 13. For the purposes of sections 571.101 to 571.121,
335 the term "sheriff" shall include the sheriff of any county

336 or city not within a county or his or her designee and in
337 counties of the first classification the sheriff may
338 designate the chief of police of any city, town, or
339 municipality within such county.

340 14. For the purposes of this chapter, "concealed carry
341 permit" shall include any concealed carry endorsement issued
342 by the department of revenue before January 1, 2014, and any
343 concealed carry document issued by any sheriff or under the
344 authority of any sheriff after December 31, 2013.

571.205. 1. Upon request and payment of the required
2 fee, the sheriff shall issue a concealed carry permit that
3 is valid through the state of Missouri for the lifetime of
4 the permit holder to a Missouri resident who meets the
5 requirements of sections 571.205 to 571.230, known as a
6 Missouri lifetime concealed carry permit. A person may also
7 request, and the sheriff shall issue upon payment of the
8 required fee, a concealed carry permit that is valid through
9 the state of Missouri for a period of either ten years or
10 twenty-five years from the date of issuance or renewal to a
11 Missouri resident who meets the requirements of sections
12 571.205 to 571.230. Such permit shall be known as a
13 Missouri extended concealed carry permit. A person issued a
14 Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit shall
15 be required to comply with the provisions of sections
16 571.205 to 571.230. If the applicant can show qualification
17 as provided by sections 571.205 to 571.230, the sheriff
18 shall issue a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry
19 permit authorizing the carrying of a concealed firearm on or
20 about the applicant's person or within a vehicle.

21 2. A Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry
22 permit shall be suspended if the permit holder becomes a
23 resident of another state. The permit may be reactivated

24 upon reestablishment of Missouri residency if the applicant
25 meets the requirements of sections 571.205 to 571.230, and
26 upon successful completion of a name-based inquiry of the
27 National Instant Background Check System.

28 3. A Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry
29 permit shall be issued by the sheriff or his or her designee
30 of the county or city in which the applicant resides, if the
31 applicant:

32 (1) Is at least nineteen years of age, is a citizen or
33 permanent resident of the United States and has assumed
34 residency in this state, or is at least eighteen years of
35 age and a member of the United States Armed Forces or
36 honorably discharged from the United States Armed Forces,
37 and is a citizen of the United States and has assumed
38 residency in this state;

39 (2) Has not [pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo
40 contendere or] been convicted of a crime punishable by
41 imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under the laws of
42 any state or of the United States, other than a crime
43 classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and
44 punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less
45 that does not involve an explosive weapon, firearm, firearm
46 silencer, or gas gun;

47 (3) Has not been convicted of[, pled guilty to or
48 entered a plea of nolo contendere to] one or more
49 misdemeanor offenses involving crimes of violence within a
50 five-year period immediately preceding application for a
51 Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit or if
52 the applicant has not been convicted of two or more
53 misdemeanor offenses involving driving while under the
54 influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs or the possession
55 or abuse of a controlled substance within a five-year period

56 immediately preceding application for a Missouri lifetime or
57 extended concealed carry permit;

58 (4) Is not a fugitive from justice or currently
59 charged in an information or indictment with the commission
60 of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding
61 one year under the laws of any state of the United States,
62 other than a crime classified as a misdemeanor under the
63 laws of any state and punishable by a term of imprisonment
64 of two years or less that does not involve an explosive
65 weapon, firearm, firearm silencer, or gas gun;

66 (5) Has not been discharged under dishonorable
67 conditions from the United States Armed Forces;

68 (6) Has not engaged in a pattern of behavior,
69 documented in public or closed records, that causes the
70 sheriff to have a reasonable belief that the applicant
71 presents a danger to himself or herself or others;

72 (7) Is not adjudged mentally incompetent at the time
73 of application or for five years prior to application, or
74 has not been committed to a mental health facility, as
75 defined in section 632.005, or a similar institution located
76 in another state following a hearing at which the defendant
77 was represented by counsel or a representative;

78 (8) Submits a completed application for a permit as
79 described in subsection 4 of this section;

80 (9) Submits an affidavit attesting that the applicant

87 4. The application for a Missouri lifetime or extended
88 concealed carry permit issued by the sheriff of the county

92 gender, date and place of birth, and, if the applicant is
93 not a United States citizen, the applicant's country of
94 citizenship and any alien or admission number issued by the

97 (2) An affirmation that the applicant has assumed
98 residency in Missouri and is a citizen or permanent resident
99 of the United States;

100 (3) An affirmation that the applicant is at least
101 nineteen years of age or is eighteen years of age or older
102 and a member of the United States Armed Forces or honorably
103 discharged from the United States Armed Forces;

104 (4) An affirmation that the applicant has not [pled
105 guilty to or] been convicted of a crime punishable by
106 imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under the laws of
107 any state or of the United States other than a crime
108 classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and
109 punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less
110 that does not involve an explosive weapon, firearm, firearm
111 silencer, or gas gun;

112 (5) An affirmation that the applicant has not been
113 convicted of[, pled guilty to, or entered a plea of nolo
114 contendere to] one or more misdemeanor offenses involving

117 not been convicted of two or more misdemeanor offenses

150 (11) A conspicuous warning that false statements made
151 by the applicant will result in prosecution for perjury
152 under the laws of the state of Missouri; and

153 (12) A government-issued photo identification. This
154 photograph shall not be included on the permit and shall
155 only be used to verify the person's identity for the
156 issuance of a new permit, issuance of a new permit due to
157 change of name or address, renewal of an extended permit, or
158 for a lost or destroyed permit, or reactivation under
159 subsection 2 of this section.

160 5. An application for a Missouri lifetime or extended
161 concealed carry permit shall be made to the sheriff of the
162 county in which the applicant resides. An application shall
163 be filed in writing, signed under oath and under the
164 penalties of perjury, and shall state whether the applicant
165 complies with each of the requirements specified in
166 subsection 3 of this section. In addition to the completed
167 application, the applicant for a Missouri lifetime or
168 extended concealed carry permit shall also submit the
169 following:

170 (1) A photocopy of a firearms safety training
171 certificate of completion or other evidence of completion of
172 a firearms safety training course that meets the standards
173 established in subsection 1 or 2 of section 571.111; and

174 (2) A nonrefundable permit fee as provided by
175 subsection 12 of this section.

176 6. (1) Before an application for a Missouri lifetime
177 or extended concealed carry permit is approved, the sheriff
178 shall make only such inquiries as he or she deems necessary
179 into the accuracy of the statements made in the
180 application. The sheriff may require that the applicant
181 display a Missouri driver's license or nondriver's license

182 or military identification. No biometric data shall be
183 collected from the applicant. The sheriff shall conduct an
184 inquiry of the National Instant Criminal Background Check
185 System within three working days after submission of the
186 properly completed application for a Missouri lifetime or
187 extended concealed carry permit. Upon receipt of the
188 completed report from the National Instant Criminal
189 Background Check System, the sheriff shall examine the
190 results and, if no disqualifying information is identified,
191 shall issue a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry
192 permit within three working days.

193 (2) In the event the report from the National Instant
194 Criminal Background Check System and the response from the
195 Federal Bureau of Investigation national criminal history
196 record check prescribed by subdivision (1) of this
197 subsection are not completed within forty-five calendar days
198 and no disqualifying information concerning the applicant
199 has otherwise come to the sheriff's attention, the sheriff
200 shall issue a provisional permit, clearly designated on the
201 certificate as such, which the applicant shall sign in the
202 presence of the sheriff or the sheriff's designee. This
203 permit, when carried with a valid Missouri driver's or
204 nondriver's license, shall permit the applicant to exercise
205 the same rights in accordance with the same conditions as
206 pertain to a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry
207 permit issued under this section, provided that it shall not
208 serve as an alternative to a national instant criminal
209 background check required by 18 U.S.C. Section 922(t). The
210 provisional permit shall remain valid until such time as the
211 sheriff either issues or denies the permit under subsection
212 7 or 8 of this section. The sheriff shall revoke a
213 provisional permit issued under this subsection within

214 twenty-four hours of receipt of any report that identifies a
215 disqualifying record, and shall notify the concealed carry
216 permit system established under subsection 5 of section
217 650.350. The revocation of a provisional permit issued
218 under this section shall be prescribed in a manner
219 consistent to the denial and review of an application under
220 subsection 7 of this section.

221 7. The sheriff may refuse to approve an application
222 for a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit
223 if he or she determines that any of the requirements
224 specified in subsection 3 of this section have not been met,
225 or if he or she has a substantial and demonstrable reason to
226 believe that the applicant has rendered a false statement
227 regarding any of the provisions of sections 571.205 to
228 571.230. If the applicant is found to be ineligible, the
229 sheriff is required to deny the application, and notify the
230 applicant in writing, stating the grounds for denial and
231 informing the applicant of the right to submit, within
232 thirty days, any additional documentation relating to the
233 grounds of the denial. Upon receiving any additional
234 documentation, the sheriff shall reconsider his or her
235 decision and inform the applicant within thirty days of the
236 result of the reconsideration. The applicant shall further
237 be informed in writing of the right to appeal the denial
238 under section 571.220. After two additional reviews and
239 denials by the sheriff, the person submitting the
240 application shall appeal the denial under section 571.220.

241 8. If the application is approved, the sheriff shall
242 issue a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit
243 to the applicant within a period not to exceed three working
244 days after his or her approval of the application. The
245 applicant shall sign the Missouri lifetime or extended

246 concealed carry permit in the presence of the sheriff or his
247 or her designee.

248 9. The Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry
249 permit shall specify only the following information:

250 (1) Name, address, date of birth, gender, height,
251 weight, color of hair, color of eyes, and signature of the
252 permit holder;

253 (2) The signature of the sheriff issuing the permit;

254 (3) The date of issuance;

255 (4) A clear statement indicating that the permit is
256 only valid within the state of Missouri; and

257 (5) If the permit is a Missouri extended concealed
258 carry permit, the expiration date.

259 The permit shall be no larger than two and one-eighth inches
260 wide by three and three-eighths inches long and shall be of
261 a uniform style prescribed by the department of public
262 safety. The permit shall also be assigned a concealed carry
263 permit system county code and shall be stored in sequential
264 number.

265 10. (1) The sheriff shall keep a record of all
266 applications for a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed
267 carry permit or a provisional permit and his or her action
268 thereon. Any record of an application that is incomplete or
269 denied for any reason shall be kept for a period not to
270 exceed one year.

271 (2) The sheriff shall report the issuance of a
272 Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit or
273 provisional permit to the concealed carry permit system.
274 All information on any such permit that is protected
275 information on any driver's or nondriver's license shall
276 have the same personal protection for purposes of sections

277 571.205 to 571.230. An applicant's status as a holder of a
278 Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit or
279 provisional permit shall not be public information and shall
280 be considered personal protected information. Information
281 retained in the concealed carry permit system under this
282 subsection shall not be distributed to any federal, state,
283 or private entities and shall only be made available for a
284 single entry query of an individual in the event the
285 individual is a subject of interest in an active criminal
286 investigation or is arrested for a crime. A sheriff may
287 access the concealed carry permit system for administrative
288 purposes to issue a permit, verify the accuracy of permit
289 holder information, change the name or address of a permit
290 holder, suspend or revoke a permit, cancel an expired
291 permit, or cancel a permit upon receipt of a certified death
292 certificate for the permit holder. Any person who violates
293 the provisions of this subdivision by disclosing protected
294 information shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

295 11. Information regarding any holder of a Missouri
296 lifetime or extended concealed carry permit is a closed
297 record. No bulk download or batch data shall be distributed
298 to any federal, state, or private entity, except to MoSMART
299 or a designee thereof.

300 12. For processing an application, the sheriff in each
301 county shall charge a nonrefundable fee not to exceed:

302 (1) Two hundred dollars for a new Missouri extended
303 concealed carry permit that is valid for ten years from the
304 date of issuance or renewal;

305 (2) Two hundred fifty dollars for a new Missouri
306 extended concealed carry permit that is valid for twenty-
307 five years from the date of issuance or renewal;

308 (3) Fifty dollars for a renewal of a Missouri extended
309 concealed carry permit;

310 (4) Five hundred dollars for a Missouri lifetime
311 concealed carry permit,

312 which shall be paid to the treasury of the county to the
313 credit of the sheriff's revolving fund.

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
