9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11	Section 1. Section 25-13-609, MCA, is amended to read:
12	"25-13-609. Personal property exempt subject to value limitations. A judgment debtor is entitled to
13	exemption from execution of the following:
14	(1) the judgment debtor's interest, not to exceed \$4,500 in aggregate value, to the extent of a value not
15	exceeding \$600 in any item of property, in household furnishings and goods, appliances, jewelry, wearing
16	apparel, books, firearms and other sporting goods, animals, feed, crops, and musical instruments;
17	(2) the judgment debtor's interest, not to exceed \$2,500 in value, in one motor vehicle; and
18	(3) the judgment debtor's interest, not to exceed \$3,000 in aggregate value, in any implements,
19	professional books, and tools <del>, of</del> used in the trade of the judgment debtor or a dependent of the judgment debtor-
20	<u>and</u>
21	(4) the judgment debtor's interest, not to exceed \$600 in value, in one checking or savings account that
22	is used for personal or household purposes and not for business expenses."
