6	REPOSITORY OF THE ED MCGIVERN MUSEUM COLLECTION; DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF						
7	COMMERCE AND THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO IDENTIFY IT ON OFFICIAL STATE MAPS						
8	AND HIGHWAY SIGNS; REQUIRING THE CAPITOL COMPLEX ADVISORY COUNCIL TO NAME A BUILDING						
9	AT THE MONTANA LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY AFTER ED MCGIVERN; AND PROVIDING A

12	WHEREAS, Ed McGivern (October 20, 1874 - December 12, 1957) lived in Lewistown and Great Falls,						
13	Montana; and						
14	WHEREAS, Ed McGivern was an ordinary, unpretentious man who made his living painting signs; and						
15	WHEREAS, most Montanans have not heard of Ed McGivern or of his accomplishments as a Montanan;						
16	and						
17	WHEREAS, Ed McGivern was a nationally recognized exhibition revolver shooter (both double-action						
18	and single-action); and						
19	WHEREAS, Ed McGivern was a pioneer in scientifically investigating and documenting the capabilities						
20	of the revolver and in developing his own shooting methods and timing devices; and						
21	WHEREAS, numerous articles by Ed McGivern and about him were published in "Guns", "Guns						
22	Quarterly", "American Rifleman", "Western Wildlife", "Sports Afield", "Outdoor Life", "True West", "Adventure",						
23	"All Western Magazine", "Voice of the Sportsman", "Denver Post Empire", "Lewistown News Argus", "Great Falls						
24	Tribune", "Shooting Times", and "Life Magazine"; and						
25	WHEREAS, Ed McGivern is renowned as one of the best handgunners that ever lived; and						
26	WHEREAS, Ed McGivern authored the book "Fast and Fancy Revolver Shooting", published in 1938;						
27	and						
28	WHEREAS, Ed McGivern trained Montana law enforcement and Federal Bureau of Investigation officers						
29	in revolver shooting; and						
30	WHEREAS, Ed McGivern was appointed Colonel, Ballistic Corps, Ordnance Department of the Montana

National Guard by Governor Roy Ayers in December 1940, was an honorary member of the Montana Highway 1 2 Patrol and the Lewistown Police Department, was a member of the Montana Sheriffs and Peace Officers 3 Association, was a member of the Montana Police Protective Association, and was a life member of the Ed 4 McGivern Pistol Club in Great Falls; and 5 WHEREAS, Ed McGivern set many shooting records with the revolver; and 6 WHEREAS, Ed McGivern shot with factory double-action revolvers that were unmodified except for his 7 famous McGivern gold bead front sight; and 8 WHEREAS, Ed McGivern's speed record (set several times) for shooting five shots from a double-action 9 revolver in 2/5 of a second with all shots in the area of a playing card at 15 feet has never been equaled; and 10 WHEREAS, this rate of fire is greater than the cyclical rate of the AK-47 automatic rifle; and 11 WHEREAS, this record was set when Ed McGivern was 58 years old; and 12 WHEREAS, Ed McGivern could shoot two double-action revolvers simultaneously from the left and right 13 hands in 1 1/5 seconds and keep both five-shot groups within the area of a playing card at 15 feet; with the draw 14 included, he could do the same in 1 1/2 seconds; and 15 WHEREAS, Ed McGivern could empty two double-action revolvers, one after the other in less than 2 16 seconds; and 17 WHEREAS, Ed McGivern excelled in aerial shooting with a double-action revolver; and 18 WHEREAS, Ed McGivern broke six simultaneously hand-thrown aerial clay targets with a double-action 19 revolver at the Central Montana Fair in Lewistown in 1932 and could shoot a can thrown 20 feet in the air six 20 times: and 21 WHEREAS, Ed McGivern was known as a firearms expert and testified in at least 37 trials involving 22 firearms between 1914 and 1943. 23 24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 25 26 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Official home REPOSITORY of Ed McGivern museum COLLECTION. (1) The 27 CENTRAL MONTANA MUSEUM IN THE town of Lewistown is designated the "official home REPOSITORY of the Ed

McGivern museum COLLECTION".

(3) The department of transportation shall erect and maintain signs designating the <u>CENTRAL MONTANA</u>

<u>MUSEUMINTHE</u> town of Lewistown as the official home <u>REPOSITORY</u> of the Ed McGivern museum <u>COLLECTION</u> along highways in the vicinity of Lewistown and shall accomplish the signing changes in accordance with the department's normal sign maintenance and replacement schedule.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Building at Montana law enforcement academy to be named for Ed McGivern. The capitol complex advisory council provided for in 2-17-803 shall name an appropriate building at the Montana law enforcement academy after Ed McGivern.

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 1, chapter 1, part 5, and the provisions of Title 1, chapter 1, part 5, apply to [section 1].
