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4	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
5	MONTANA URGING SUPPORT FOR PASSENGER RAIL SERVICES IN MONTANA.
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7	WHEREAS, trains are one of the most energy-efficient ways to move people; and
8	WHEREAS, commercial airline service to many counties and communities in Montana is inadequate; and
9	WHEREAS, some communities in Montana are poorly served by public transportation, and passenger
10	rail services provide mobility for senior citizens, persons with disabilities, students, and business people; and
11	WHEREAS, Amtrak was created in 1971 from what remained of private passenger railroads and has
12	been starved of investment and direction from the United States Congress and several presidential
13	administrations; and
14	WHEREAS, the North Coast Hiawatha ceased operation through southern Montana in 1979, and
15	transportation to and from the major population centers of southern Montana would be greatly enhanced by
16	passenger rail service; and
17	WHEREAS, restoring passenger rail service through southern Montana would stimulate Montana's
18	economy through increased tourism spending and an associated increase in job opportunities; and
19	WHEREAS, tourism is Montana's second-largest industry and would be enhanced by improved
20	passenger rail service along the Hi-line; and
21	WHEREAS, increased passenger rail services will increase railroad-related employment because of the
22	need for upgraded rail infrastructure and operating personnel; and
23	WHEREAS, the Empire Builder is one of the most popular long-distance passenger trains in the United
24	States and is greatly needed for the citizens of Montana's Hi-line who have limited public transportation options,
25	but is challenged by lack of rail capacity causing frequent delays.

27	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
28	STATE OF MONTANA:
29	(1) That the United States Congress is urged to take tangible steps to secure funding for and develop
30	plans to restore passenger rail service through southern Montana. This should be part of a national essential

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passenger rail policy that does not sacrifice the passenger rail needs of the rural American West for intercity
 high-speed rail.

- (2) That Congress continue to support the Empire Builder, which is a critical transportation component
 along Montana's Hi-line.
 - (3) That the Secretary of State send copies of this resolution to Montana's Congressional Delegation, the Majority Leader of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the President of the United States, the United States Secretary of Transportation, and the Amtrak Board of Directors.

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
