8	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
9	MONTANA SUPPORTING THE RESPONSIBLE DEVELOPMENT OF COAL RESOURCES AND COAL-BASED
10	ELECTRICITY.

12	WHEREAS, coal represents the most abundant source of energy in the United States; and
13	WHEREAS, coal is one of the most reliable and affordable sources of fuel for electric generation; and
14	WHEREAS, consumers, businesses, communities, and service providers need affordable energy more
15	than ever in this time of economic uncertainty and stand to benefit from affordable and reliable coal-based
16	electricity; and
17	WHEREAS, the United States holds more coal reserves than any other nation, and Montana is home to
18	the largest coal reserves in the United States with nearly one-third of the estimated recoverable reserves; and
19	WHEREAS, Montana's annual coal production is currently only 1/20 of 1% of estimated recoverable
20	reserves, and at our current rate of production, it would take more than 1,600 years to exhaust Montana's coa
21	reserves; and
22	WHEREAS, responsible development of Montana's coal resources will create thousands of new jobs and
23	provide millions of dollars in tax revenue for state and local governments and schools; and
24	WHEREAS, the coal reserves in Montana can meet the demands of the domestic market and earn
25	revenue for the state of Montana by being exported to foreign markets via West Coast ports; and
26	WHEREAS, coal-generated electricity has increased by 183% since 1970, while emissions from
27	coal-based power plants have been reduced by 75% per generation unit; and
28	WHEREAS, Montana, the Treasure State, has abundant natural resources and produces valuable
29	commodities from agriculture, mining, timber, energy, and manufacturing industries; and
30	WHEREAS, expanded, responsible development of Montana's natural resources would benefit every

1 Montanan by creating thousands of new jobs, new economic opportunities, and billions of dollars in tax revenue

2 for state and local governments and schools; and

WHEREAS, producers of Montana commodities need access to all markets, foreign and domestic, in
