SUMMARY—Revises various provisions relating to public records.  
(BDR 19-211)

AN ACT relating to public records; revising provisions governing requests for books and records of certain agencies of the Executive Department of the State Government; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel’s Digest:**

1 Under existing law, all public books and records of a governmental entity, the  
2 contents of which are not otherwise declared by law to be confidential, are required  
3 to be open at all times during office hours for inspection and copying by the public.  
4 (NRS 239.010) The Nevada Supreme Court has established a balancing test for a  
5 governmental entity to apply to determine whether to disclose a book or record  
6 when the law is silent with respect to the confidentiality of the book or record.  
7 Under this balancing test, the governmental entity is required to determine whether  
8 the private or governmental interest served by withholding the book or record  
9 clearly outweighs the right of the public to inspect or copy the book or record.  
10 (*Donrey v. Bradshaw*, 106 Nev. 630 (1990); *DR Partners v. Board of County*  
11 *Comm’rs*, 116 Nev. 616 (2000); *Reno Newspapers, Inc. v. Haley*, 126 Nev. Adv.  
12 *Op.* 23, 234 P.3d 922 (2010); *Reno Newspapers, Inc. v. Gibbons*, 127 Nev. Adv.  
13 *Op.* 79, 266 P.3d 623 (2011)) The legislative declaration for the Nevada Public  
14 Records Act (chapter 239 of NRS) requires that the Act be construed liberally to  
15 foster democratic principles by providing the public with access to inspect and copy  
16 public books and records and that any restriction on the disclosure of public books  
17 and records be construed narrowly. (NRS 239.001) Existing law imposes the  
18 burden of proof on a governmental entity that withholds a record to prove, by a  
19 preponderance of the evidence, that the record, or a part thereof, is confidential.  
20 (NRS 239.0113)

21 **Section 1** of this bill requires the head of each agency, bureau, board,  
22 commission, department, division or any other unit of the Executive Department of



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23 State Government except the Nevada System of Higher Education to designate one  
24 or more employees to act as records official for the agency, whose duties relate to  
25 handling requests for public books or records of the agency. **Section 1** requires the  
26 State Library and Archives Administrator, in cooperation with the Attorney  
27 General, to prescribe: (1) the form for requesting to inspect a copy of a public book  
28 or record of such an agency; (2) the form to be used by such an agency to respond  
29 to such a request; and (3) the procedures with which a records official is required to  
30 comply in carrying out his or her duties. **Section 1** also requires each such agency  
31 to make those forms and procedures available on any website maintained by the  
32 agency on the Internet.

33 **Sections 3 and 3.5** of this bill compile all the statutory provisions that prohibit  
34 the disclosure of or specifically declare public books and records confidential.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 239 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 *1. The head of each agency of the Executive Department*  
4 *shall designate one or more employees of the agency to act as*  
5 *records official for the agency.*

6 *2. A records official designated pursuant to subsection 1 shall*  
7 *carry out the duties imposed pursuant to this chapter on the*  
8 *agency of the Executive Department that designated him or her*  
9 *with respect to a request to inspect or copy a public book or record*  
10 *of the agency.*

11 *3. The State Library and Archives Administrator, pursuant to*  
12 *NRS 378.255 and in cooperation with the Attorney General, shall*  
13 *prescribe:*

14 *(a) The form for a request by a person to inspect or copy a*  
15 *public book or record of an agency of the Executive Department*  
16 *pursuant to NRS 239.0107;*

17 *(b) The form for the written notice required to be provided by*  
18 *an agency of the Executive Department pursuant to paragraph (b),*  
19 *(c) or (d) of subsection 1 of NRS 239.0107; and*

20 *(c) By regulation the procedures with which a records official*  
21 *must comply in carrying out his or her duties.*

22 *4. Each agency of the Executive Department shall make*  
23 *available on any website maintained by the agency on the Internet*  
24 *or its successor the forms and procedures prescribed by the State*  
25 *Library and Archives Administrator and the Attorney General*  
26 *pursuant to subsection 3.*

27 **Sec. 2.** NRS 239.005 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
28 239.005 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise  
29 requires:



1 1. "Actual cost" means the direct cost related to the  
2 reproduction of a public record. The term does not include a cost  
3 that a governmental entity incurs regardless of whether or not a  
4 person requests a copy of a particular public record.

5 2. *"Agency of the Executive Department" means an agency,*  
6 *board, commission, bureau, council, department, division,*  
7 *authority or other unit of the Executive Department of the State*  
8 *Government. The term does not include the Nevada System of*  
9 *Higher Education.*

10 3. "Committee" means the Committee to Approve Schedules  
11 for the Retention and Disposition of Official State Records.

12 ~~3-1~~ 4. "Division" means the Division of State Library and  
13 Archives of the Department of Administration.

14 ~~1-1~~ 5. "Governmental entity" means:

15 (a) An elected or appointed officer of this State or of a political  
16 subdivision of this State;

17 (b) An institution, board, commission, bureau, council,  
18 department, division, authority or other unit of government of this  
19 State , *including, without limitation, an agency of the Executive*  
20 *Department,* or of a political subdivision of this State;

21 (c) A university foundation, as defined in NRS 396.405; or

22 (d) An educational foundation, as defined in NRS 388.750, to  
23 the extent that the foundation is dedicated to the assistance of public  
24 schools.

25 ~~1-1~~ 6. "Privatization contract" means a contract executed by  
26 or on behalf of a governmental entity which authorizes a private  
27 entity to provide public services that are:

28 (a) Substantially similar to the services provided by the public  
29 employees of the governmental entity; and

30 (b) In lieu of the services otherwise authorized or required to be  
31 provided by the governmental entity.

19 copyrighted pursuant to federal law.

20 2. A governmental entity may not reject a book or record  
21 which is copyrighted solely because it is copyrighted.

22 3. A governmental entity that has legal custody or control of a  
23 public book or record shall not deny a request made pursuant to  
24 subsection 1 to inspect or copy a public book or record on the basis  
25 that the requested public book or record contains information that is  
26 confidential if the governmental entity can redact, delete, conceal or  
27 separate the confidential information from the information included  
28 in the public book or record that is not otherwise confidential.

29 4. A person may request a copy of a public record in any  
30 medium in which the public record is readily available. An officer,  
31 employee or agent of a governmental entity who has legal custody  
32 or control of a public record shall not refuse to provide a copy of  
33 that public record in a readily available medium because the officer,  
34 employee or agent has already prepared or would prefer to provide  
35 the copy in a different medium.
