SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing applications for the renewal of permits to carry concealed firearms. (BDR 15-446)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact.
Effect on the State: Yes.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets ~~omitted material~~ is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to firearms; providing that certain persons who possess a permit to carry a concealed firearm may submit an application to renew the permit at any time before the permit expires; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law requires a sheriff to conduct an investigation of an applicant for a
2 permit to carry a concealed firearm, including an applicant who wishes to renew his
3 or her permit, to determine the applicant's eligibility for a permit. Within 120 days
4 after an applicant submits a complete application for a permit, the sheriff to whom
5 the application is submitted must grant or deny the application. (NRS 202.366)
6 **Section 1** of this bill provides that any person who possesses a valid permit that
7 was issued on or before June 30, 2011, and who has not since renewed the permit
8 may submit an application to renew the permit at any time before the permit
9 expires. **Section 1** also provides that if such a person submits a complete
10 application to renew the permit 180 days or more before the permit expires, the
11 sheriff to whom the application is submitted must grant or deny the application
12 within 180 days after the application is submitted.
13 **Section 2** of this bill provides that the amendatory provisions of this bill expire
14 by limitation on June 30, 2016.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 202.366 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 202.366 1. Upon receipt by a sheriff of an application for a
3 permit, including an application for the renewal of a permit pursuant
4 to NRS 202.3677, the sheriff shall conduct an investigation of the
5 applicant to determine if the applicant is eligible for a permit. In
6 conducting the investigation, the sheriff shall forward a complete set
7 of the applicant’s fingerprints to the Central Repository for Nevada
8 Records of Criminal History for submission to the Federal Bureau
9 of Investigation for its report concerning the criminal history of the
10 applicant. The investigation also must include a report from the
11 National Instant Criminal Background Check System. The sheriff
12 shall issue a permit to the applicant unless the applicant is not
13 qualified to possess a handgun pursuant to state or federal law or is
14 not otherwise qualified to obtain a permit pursuant to NRS 202.3653
15 to 202.369, inclusive, or the regulations adopted pursuant thereto.
16 2. To assist the sheriff in conducting the investigation, any
17 local law enforcement agency, including the sheriff of any county,
18 may voluntarily submit to the sheriff a report or other information
19 concerning the criminal history of an applicant.
20 3. ~~Within~~ **Except as otherwise provided in subsection 6,**
21 **within** 120 days after a complete application for a permit is
22 submitted, the sheriff to whom the application is submitted shall
23 grant or deny the application. If the application is denied, the sheriff
24 shall send the applicant written notification setting forth the reasons
25 for the denial. If the application is granted, the sheriff shall provide
26 the applicant with a permit containing a colored photograph of the
27 applicant and containing such other information as may be
28 prescribed by the Department. The permit must be in substantially

4 4. Unless suspended or revoked by the sheriff who issued the
5 permit, a permit expires 5 years after the date on which it is issued.

6 5. *Any person who possesses a valid permit that was issued on*
7 *or before June 30, 2011, and who has not since renewed the*
8 *permit may submit an application for the renewal of the permit*
9 *pursuant to NRS 202.3677 at any time before the date on which*
10 *the permit expires.*

11 6. *If a person who meets the requirements set forth in*
12 *subsection 5 submits a complete application for the renewal*
13 *of a permit pursuant to NRS 202.3677 180 days or more before*
14 *the date on which the permit expires, the sheriff to whom the*
15 *application is submitted shall, within 180 days after the*
16 *application is submitted, grant or deny the application in*
17 *accordance with the provisions of this section.*

18 7. As used in this section, “National Instant Criminal
19 Background Check System” means the national system created by
20 the federal Brady Handgun Violence Prevention Act, Public
21 Law 103-159.

22 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval
23 and expires by limitation on June 30, 2016.
