- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 15 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to the creation of a veteran scholarship program; and to provide an appropriation.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** A new chapter to title 15 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 6 State board for veteran scholarships.
- 7 There is established a state board for veteran scholarships consisting of the commissioner
- 8 of the department of veterans' affairs, a member at large appointed by the administrative
- 9 committee on veterans affairs, and the adjutant general or the adjutant general's designee. The
- 10 commissioner of the department of veterans' affairs shall serve as chairperson and the adjutant
- 11 general or the adjutant general's designee shall serve as secretary of the board for veteran
- 12 <u>scholarships. The department of veterans' affairs shall request scholarship funds and related</u>
- 13 administrative funding for the veteran scholarship program in the department's biennial budget
- 14 <u>request.</u>
- 15 **Duties of board.**
- 16 The state board for veteran scholarships shall:
- 17 1. Award scholarship grants as provided in this chapter.
- 18 <u>2. Make necessary rules and establish standards, requirements, and procedures for the</u>
 administration of this chapter.
- 20 3. Encourage veterans to attend and graduate from an accredited institution of higher
 21 education within this state, and to make application for scholarships.
- Number and nature of scholarships.
- The state board for veteran scholarships shall provide scholarships each year for veterans
- 24 so selected to enter and attend any accredited institution of higher education within this state

- 1 upon compliance with all requirements for admission and to pursue any undergraduate degree
- 2 program or graduate degree program in such institutions.
- 3 **Eligibility of candidates Determination.**
- 4 The initial and continuing scholarship eligibility of veterans must be determined by the state
- 5 board for veteran scholarships after the candidate has gained admission to an accredited
- 6 institution of higher education within this state and has had this fact certified to the board. An
- 7 eligible veteran must be a North Dakota high school graduate or a resident of North Dakota for
- 8 <u>a minimum of five years. The board may set additional eligibility requirements.</u>
- 9 <u>Definition of veteran.</u>
- As used in this chapter, "veteran" means an individual who served in the armed forces of
- 11 the United States on federal active duty for at least one hundred eighty days or the full period of
- 12 which the individual is called or ordered to active duty for reasons other than training and who
- 13 has been discharged under other than dishonorable conditions. For purposes of this chapter,
- 14 <u>veteran also means a qualifying individual of the North Dakota national guard.</u>
- 15 <u>Scholarship payments Conditions.</u>
- 16 Upon the granting of a scholarship and acceptance thereof, the recipient is eligible for a
- 17 credit in fees in the enrolling accredited institution of higher education to apply toward the cost
- 18 of registration, health, activities, board, books, and other necessary items not to exceed one
- 19 thousand five hundred dollars per academic year or seven hundred fifty dollars per semester for
- 20 two semesters, in any academic year. Veterans who are enrolled at an accredited institution of
- 21 <u>higher education on a part-time basis are eligible for a scholarship on a prorated basis. The</u>
- state board for veteran scholarships may prorate the amount of any scholarship based on funds
- 23 available. After the enrolling institution has deducted the amount due such institution, the
- 24 <u>remaining balance must be given to the recipient for necessary expenses during the semester.</u>
- 25 At the beginning of each semester of a regular academic year, the state board for veteran
- 26 scholarships shall certify to the department of veterans' affairs the name of each recipient and
- 27 the amount payable, and the department of veterans' affairs shall pay the amount of the
- 28 scholarship to the accredited institution of higher education in which the recipient is enrolled.
- 29 Renewal of the scholarship award is subject to the maintenance of a minimum grade point
- 30 average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale. The recipient is eligible to receive the scholarship for a maximum
- 31 of eight semesters for an undergraduate degree program and an additional eight semesters for

- 1 graduate or professional degree program. The state board for veteran scholarships may set
- 2 <u>additional conditions.</u>
- 3 **SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the student
- 4 loan trust fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$3,000,000, or so
- 5 much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of veterans' affairs for the purpose of
- 6 providing scholarship grants and defraying the related administrative expenses of the veteran
- 7 scholarship program, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.
