22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.9, as
2 last amended by Section 2, Chapter 4, O.S.L. 2017 (21 O.S. Supp.
3 2018, Section 1290.9), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 1290.9.

5 ELIGIBILITY

6 The following requirements shall apply to any person making
7 application to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation for a
8 handgun license pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Self-
9 Defense Act. The person must:

10 1. Be a citizen of the United States with established residency
11 in the State of Oklahoma; or

12 2. ~~Establish a residency~~ Be a lawful permanent resident in the
13 United States and have established residency in the State of
14 Oklahoma.

15 For purposes of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act, ~~the~~ the:

16 a. the term "residency" shall apply to any person who
17 either possesses a valid Oklahoma driver license or
18 state photo identification card, and physically
19 maintains a residence in this state or to any person,
20 including the spouse of such person, who has permanent
21 military orders within this state and possesses a
22 valid driver license from another state where such
23 person and spouse of such person claim residency, and

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1 b. the term "lawful permanent resident" shall mean a non-
2 citizen who is lawfully authorized to live permanently
3 within the United States;

4 3. Be at least:

5 a. twenty-one (21) years of age, or

6 b. eighteen (18) years of age but not yet twenty-one (21)
7 years of age and the person is a member or veteran of
8 the United States Armed Forces, the Reserves or
9 National Guard, or the person was discharged under
10 honorable conditions from the United States Armed
11 Forces, Reserves or National Guard;

12 4. Complete a firearms safety and training course and
13 demonstrate competence and qualifications with the type of pistol to
14 be carried by the person as provided in Section 1290.14 of this
15 title, and submit proof of training and qualification or an
16 exemption for training and qualification as authorized by Section
17 1290.14 of this title;

18 5. Submit the required fee and complete the application process
19 as provided in Section 1290.12 of this title; and

20 6. Comply in good faith with the provisions of the Oklahoma
21 Self-Defense Act.

19 ELIGIBILITY

20 The following requirements shall apply to any person making
21 application to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation for a
22 handgun license pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Self-
23 Defense Act. The person must:

24 1. Be a citizen of the United States;

1 ~~2.~~ Establish a with established residency in the State of
2 Oklahoma or a legal resident of the State of Oklahoma for a minimum
3 of five (5) years. For purposes of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act,
4 the term "~~residency~~" shall apply to "legal resident" means any
5 person who ~~either possesses a valid Oklahoma driver license or state~~
6 ~~photo identification card,~~ and physically maintains a residence in
7 this state and can establish said residency with reliable
8 documentation including, but not limited to, property tax receipts
9 or resident income tax returns or ~~to~~ any person, including the
10 spouse of such person, who has permanent military orders within this
11 state and possesses a valid driver license from another state where
12 such person and spouse of such person claim residency;

13 ~~3.~~ 2. Be at least:

- 14 a. twenty-one (21) years of age, or
- 15 b. eighteen (18) years of age but not yet twenty-one (21)
- 16 years of age and the person is a member or veteran of
- 17 the United States Armed Forces, the Reserves or

- 19 honorable conditions from the United States Armed
