Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in firearms and other dangerous 2 articles, further providing for the offense of persons not to 3 4 possess, use, manufacture, control, sell or transfer firearms. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: 8 Section 1. Section 6105(a.1)(1), (b) and (c)(2) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read: 10 § 6105. Persons not to possess, use, manufacture, control, sell 11 or transfer firearms. 12 13 (a.1) Penalty.--14 A person convicted of a felony enumerated under 15 subsection (b) [or a felony under the act of April 14, 1972 16 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled Substance, Drug, 17 Device and Cosmetic Act, or any equivalent Federal statute or 18 equivalent statute of any other state,] who violates 19 subsection (a) commits a felony of the second degree.

- 7 Act, or any equivalent Federal statute or equivalent statute of
- 8 any other state, that may be punishable by a term of
- 9 <u>imprisonment exceeding two years.</u>
- 10 (c) Other persons. -- In addition to any person who has been
- 11 convicted of any offense listed under subsection (b), the
- 12 following persons shall be subject to the prohibition of
- 13 subsection (a):

- [(2) A person who has been convicted of an offense under
- 16 the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The
- 17 Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act, or any
- 18 equivalent Federal statute or equivalent statute of any other
- state, that may be punishable by a term of imprisonment
- 20 exceeding two years.]
