A RESOLUTION

- Designating March 13, 2015, as "K9 Veterans and Services Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Throughout the history of this Commonwealth and the
- 4 nation, thousands of dogs and their handlers, trainers and other
- 5 helpers have served in the military, law enforcement and various
- 6 capacities with honor, dignity and valor to protect life,
- 7 liberty and property; and
- 8 WHEREAS, To this day, military and police and other working
- 9 dogs and their handlers, trainers and other helpers continue to
- 10 serve on both land and sea with honor, dignity and valor in this
- 11 Commonwealth, the nation and abroad; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The official United States K9 Corps was created on
- 13 March 13, 1942, for service in World War II and beyond; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Joseph J. White, a retired military working dog
- 2 handler, began an effort some years ago to establish K9 Veterans
- 3 Day on March 13 each year as a means to get the entire country
- 4 to recognize the important services provided by dogs and their
- 5 trainers, handlers and other helpers in the military, law
- 6 enforcement and otherwise to save and protect human life; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Many residents of this Commonwealth have and
- 8 continue to actively participate in and engage in K9 training
- 9 and operational activities to protect lives and property through
- 10 the military, law enforcement and other groups; and
- 11 WHEREAS, K9 services now include dogs and their handlers,
- 12 trainers and other helpers involved in customs, search and
- 13 rescue, border patrol, police services, secret service, drug
- 14 enforcement and many other capacities, all of which deserve
- 15 recognition along with the military working dogs for saving and
- 16 protecting our Commonwealth's and nation's way of life due to
- 17 the current war on terror and efforts to stop and fight crime;

- 19 WHEREAS, The military, law enforcement and many other
- 20 government agencies and groups have recognized K9 dogs as being
- 21 loyal, loving, devoted and known for placing themselves in
- 22 harm's way to make the ultimate sacrifice and lay down their
- 23 lives for their partners, handlers, trainers and other helpers;
- 24 therefore be it
- 25 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate March
- 26 13, 2015, as "K9 Veterans and Services Day" in Pennsylvania to
- 27 acknowledge, support and express thanks for the assistance and
- 28 security provided by dogs and their trainers, handlers and other
- 29 helpers in the military, law enforcement and other services
- 30 geared toward protecting life and property in this Commonwealth

- 2 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge all
- 3 governmental agencies and other groups that have and continue to
- 4 use K9 services to make efforts on March 13, 2015, to recognize
- 5 and appreciate the protection and assistance that such services
