A RESOLUTION

- 1 Celebrating the Pennsylvania State Police Academy.
- WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State Police was established as an
- 3 executive department of State government by an act of the
- 4 General Assembly in 1905 and became not only the first uniformed
- 5 police organization of its kind in the nation, but also a model
- 6 for other state police agencies throughout the country; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Initially, newly enlisted Pennsylvania State
- 8 Policemen, referred to as "probationers," turned to their
- 9 commanding officer and senior men of the troop for training in
- 10 the skills they needed for police work; and
- 11 WHEREAS, A more standardized and efficient method was needed

- 1 and, in 1910, the superintendent designated Troop C Pottsville
- 2 as a training center for all student recruits; and
- 3 WHEREAS, In 1921, an act of the General Assembly allowed for
- 4 the first official State Police Training School to be
- 5 established in Newville, Cumberland County; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Three years later the training school was moved to
- 7 better facilities on Cocoa Avenue in Hershey, Dauphin County;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, From 1924 to 1959, the Hershey Training School
- 10 molded student recruits into the finest troopers in the nation;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, As the complement grew steadily, it became apparent
- 13 that the needs of the department were outgrowing the facilities
- 14 on Cocoa Avenue; and
- 15 WHEREAS, In an effort to keep the training school in the
- 16 area, the Hershey Estates Board of Directors sold 28 acres of
- 17 land situated atop "The Hill," which allowed the department to
- 18 build a state-of-the-art facility; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Act 112 of 1959 pronounced that the new training
- 20 school would be known as the State Police Academy, rather than
- 21 the State Police Training School and, in 1960, the act was
- 22 amended to change the enlistee's title from "Student Recruit" to
- 23 "Cadet"; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Due to this legacy of intense and thorough training,
- 25 the Pennsylvania State Police Academy is still considered the
- 26 West Point of all police training schools in the country and
- 27 continues to produce the most well-trained troopers in the
- 28 world; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Currently, the training offered at the academy is
- 30 designed to prepare the cadets for field assignments and

- 1 emphasizes such subjects as criminal law and procedure, the
- 2 Vehicle Code, accident investigation, firearms training and
- 3 self-defense; and
- 4 WHEREAS, One of the unique phases of the student's training
- 5 revolves around equitation skills; and
- 6 WHEREAS, In addition to cadet training, the academy and
- 7 former training schools have also performed specialized police
- 8 services as needed; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Today, the academy coordinates community service
- 10 programs, oversees the Ceremonial Unit and Tactical Mounted Unit
- 11 and offers in-service training programs for State Police
- 12 personnel and training courses for municipal officers; and
- WHEREAS, Since its opening in 1960, 141 classes of cadets
- 14 have graduated from the academy in Hershey; and
- WHEREAS, Two classes graduated in 2015, consisting of 122
- 16 cadets, men and women, on May 22, 2015, and 95 cadets on
- 17 December 4, 2015; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State Police Academy continues to
- 19 produce the finest troopers in order to provide the residents of
- 20 this Commonwealth with the most effective Statewide law
- 21 enforcement system possible; therefore be it
- 22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives celebrate the
- 23 Pennsylvania State Police Academy.
