It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 8-8.1-3 of the General Laws in Chapter 8-8.1 entitled "Domestic

Assault" is hereby amended to read as follows:

8-8.1-3. Protective orders -- Penalty -- Jurisdiction.

- (a) A person suffering from domestic abuse may file a complaint in the district court requesting any order which will protect her or him from the abuse, including but not limited to any or all of the following terms:
- 7 (1) Ordering that the defendant be restrained and enjoined from contacting, assaulting, 8 molesting, or otherwise interfering with the plaintiff at home, on the street, or elsewhere, whether 9 the defendant is an adult or minor;
 - (2) Ordering the defendant to vacate the household forthwith, unless the defendant holds sole legal interest in the household;
- 12 (3) Upon motion by the plaintiff, his or her address shall be released only at the discretion 13 of the district court judge;
 - (4) Ordering the defendant to surrender physical possession of all firearms in his or her possession, care, custody, or control and shall further order a person restrained not to purchase or receive, or attempt to purchase or receive, any firearms while the protective order is in effect. The defendant shall surrender said firearms within twenty four (24) hours of notice of the protective order to the Rhode Island state police or local police department or to a federally licensed

19 firearms dealer.

1	(b) Upon a finding of immediate risk of injury or narm pursuant to § 8-8.1-4, the court
2	shall enter, in addition to any other relief granted, an ex parte order granting the relief requested,
3	including ordering the immediate surrender of any firearms in the defendant's possession, care,
4	custody or control and shall further order a person restrained under this section not to purchase,
5	receive or attempt to purchase or receive any firearms, pending a hearing on the merits which
6	shall be held within twenty-one (21) days.
7	(1) A defendant ordered to surrender firearms shall, within twenty-four (24) hours of
8	notice of the protective order, surrender all firearms to the Rhode Island state police or local
9	police department or to a federally licensed firearms dealer.
10	(i)(2) A person ordered to surrender possession of any firearm(s) pursuant to this section
11	shall, within seventy-two (72) hours after being served with the order, either:
12	(A)(i) File with the court a receipt showing the firearm(s) was physically surrendered to
13	the Rhode Island state police or local police department, or to a federally licensed firearm dealer;
14	or
15	(B)(ii) Attest to the court that, at the time of the order, the person ordered to surrender
16	possession of firearms had no firearms in his or her immediate physical possession or control, or
17	subject to his or her immediate physical possession or control, and that the person, at the time of
18	the attestation, has no firearms were in or subject to his or her immediate physical possession or
19	control or subject to his or her immediate physical possession or control.
20	(iii) Sworn peace officers as defined in § 12-7-21 and active members of military service,
21	including members of reserve components thereof, who are required by law or departmental
22	policy to carry departmental firearms while on duty, or any person who is required by their
23	employment to carry a firearm in the performance of their duties, shall, in addition to the
24	requirements under subsections (b)(2)(i) and (b)(2)(ii) of this section, file an attestation of
25	exemption with the court certifying that they are exempt from surrendering their departmental
26	firearm, and that they shall be abide by the restrictions set forth in § 8-8.1-3(i).
27	(iv) Notices of surrender or attestations filed with the district court pursuant to subsection
28	(b)(2)(i), (b)(2)(ii) or (b)(2)(iii) of this section shall be kept under seal and shall not be part of the
29	public record.
30	(ii)(v) If a person restrained under this section transfers a firearm(s) to a federally
31	
	licensed firearms dealer pursuant to this section, the person restrained under this section may
32	licensed firearms dealer pursuant to this section, the person restrained under this section may instruct the federally licensed firearms dealer to sell the firearm(s) or to transfer ownership in

1	or relationship as defined by § 15-15-1(7), and who is not prohibited from possessing firearms
2	under state or federal law. The owner of any firearm(s) sold shall receive any financial value
3	received from its sale, less the cost associated with taking possession of, storing, and transferring
4	of the firearm(s).
5	(iii)(vi) Every individual to whom possession of a firearm(s) is transferred pursuant to
6	this subsection shall be prohibited from transferring or returning any firearm(s) to the person
7	restrained under this section while the protective order remains in effect and shall be informed of
8	this prohibition. Any knowing violation of this subsection is a felony that shall be punishable by a
9	fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or by imprisonment for a term of not less
10	than one year and not more than five (5) years, or both.
11	(iv)(vii) An individual to whom possession of a firearm(s) is transferred pursuant to this
12	subsection shall return a firearm(s) to the person formerly restrained under this section only if the
13	person formerly restrained under this section provides documentation issued by a court indicating
14	that the restraining order issued pursuant to this section that prohibited the person from
15	purchasing, carrying, transporting, or possessing firearms has expired and has not been extended.
16	(b)(c) After notice to the respondent defendant and after a hearing, which shall be held
17	within fifteen (15) days of surrendering said firearms, if the complaint is granted, the court, in
18	addition to any other restrictions, may, for any protective order issued or renewed on or after July
19	1, 2017, continue the order of surrender, and shall further order a person restrained under this
20	section not to purchase or receive, or attempt to purchase or receive, any firearms while the
21	protective order is in effect shall make whatever orders it deems necessary for the protection of
22	the plaintiff from abuse, and in addition, the court shall extend the ex parte order of firearm(s)
23	surrender, or if no such ex parte order was previously made, the court shall order the immediate
24	surrender of any firearms in the defendant's possession, care, custody or control and shall further
25	order a person restrained under this section not to purchase, receive, or attempt to purchase or
26	receive, any firearms while the protective order is in effect.
27	(c)(d) The district court shall provide a notice on all forms requesting a protective order
28	that a person restrained under this section shall be ordered pursuant to § 11-47-5, to surrender
29	possession or control of any firearms and not to purchase or receive, or attempt to purchase or
30	receive, any firearms while the restraining order is in effect. The form shall further provide that
31	any person who has surrendered their firearms <u>pursuant to an ex parte order</u> shall be afforded a
32	hearing within fifteen (15) days of surrendering their firearms contemporaneously with the
33	hearing on the merits of the underlying complaint for a protective order.
34	(d)(e) Any firearm surrendered in accordance with this section to the Rhode Island state

1	police or local police department shall be returned to the person formerly restrained under this
2	section upon their request when:
3	(1) The person formerly restrained under this section produces documentation issued by a
4	court indicating that the restraining order issued pursuant to this section that prohibited the person
5	from purchasing, carrying, transporting, or possessing firearms has expired and has not been
6	extended; and
7	(2) The law enforcement agency in possession of the firearms determines that the person
8	formerly restrained under this section is not otherwise prohibited from possessing a firearm under
9	state or federal law.
10	(3) The person required to surrender his or her firearms pursuant to this section shall not
11	be responsible for any costs of storage of any firearms surrendered pursuant to this section.
12	(e)(f) The Rhode Island state police are authorized to develop rules and procedures
13	pertaining to the storage and return of firearms surrendered to the Rhode Island state police or
14	local police departments pursuant to this section. The Rhode Island state police may consult with
15	the Rhode Island Police Chiefs' Association in developing rules and procedures.
16	(f)(g) Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit, expand, or in any way modify
17	orders issued under §§ 12-29-4 or 15-5-19.
18	(g)(h) Nothing in this section shall limit a defendant's right under existing law to petition
19	the court at a later date for modification of the order.
20	(h)(1) When a defendant files a motion with the court for a modification of an order to
21	surrender their firearm(s), the The court shall immediately notify the person suffering from
22	domestic abuse whose complaint gave rise to the protective order, the Rhode Island state police,
23	the attorney general and the local law enforcement agency of the city or town in which where the
24	person restrained under this section resides, of the hearing.
25	(i)(2) The person suffering from domestic abuse, the Rhode Island state police, the
26	attorney general, local law enforcement, and the person restrained under this section shall all have
27	an opportunity to be present and to testify when the court considers the petition motion for
28	modification.
29	(i)(3) At the hearing, the person restrained under this section shall have the burden of
30	showing, by clear and convincing evidence, that, if his or her firearm rights were restored, he or
31	she would not pose a danger to the person suffering from domestic abuse or to any other person
32	and that possession of a firearm while subject to the protective order already granted after a
33	hearing on the merits would not constitute a federal crime under 18 U.S.C. §§ 922(G)(8) and/or
34	<u>(9)</u> .

•	(1) in determining whether to restore a person's meant rights, the court shall examine an
2	relevant evidence, including, but not limited to: the complaint seeking a protective order; the
3	criminal record of the person restrained under this section; the mental health history of the person
4	restrained under this section; any evidence that the person restrained under this section has, since
5	being served with the order, engaged in violent or threatening behavior against the person
6	suffering from domestic abuse or any other person.
7	(2)(4) If the court determines, after a review of all relevant evidence and after all parties
8	have had an opportunity to be heard, that the person restrained under this section would not pose
9	a danger to the person suffering from domestic abuse or to any other person if his or her firearm
10	rights were restored, then the court may grant the petition and modify the protective order and lift
11	the firearm prohibition.
12	(3)(5) If the court lifts a person's firearms prohibition pursuant to this subsection, the
13	court shall issue the person written notice that he or she is no longer prohibited under this section
14	from purchasing or possessing firearms while the protective order is in effect.
15	(k)(i) The prohibition against possessing a firearm(s) due solely to the existence of a
16	domestic violence restraining order issued under this section shall not apply with respect to sworn
17	peace officers as defined in § 12-7-21 and active members of military service, including members
18	of the reserve components thereof, who are required by law or departmental policy to carry
19	departmental firearms while on duty or any person who is required by his or her employment to
20	carry a firearm in the performance of his or her duties. Any individual exempted pursuant to this
21	exception may possess a firearm only during the course of his or her employment. Any firearm
22	required for employment must be stored at the place of employment when not being possessed for
23	employment use; all other firearm(s) must be surrendered in accordance with this section.
24	(1)(j)(1) Any violation of the aforementioned protective order requirements of this section
25	shall subject the defendant to being found in contempt of court.
26	(2) The contempt order shall not be exclusive and shall not preclude any other available
27	civil or criminal remedies. Any relief granted by the court shall be for a fixed period of time not
28	to exceed three (3) years, at the expiration of which time the court may extend any order upon
29	motion of the plaintiff, for such additional time as the court deems necessary to protect the
30	plaintiff from abuse. The court may modify its order at any time upon motion of either party.
31	(m)(k) No order shall issue under this section that would have the effect of compelling a
32	defendant who has the sole legal interest in a residence to vacate that residence.
33	(n) The contempt order shall not be exclusive and shall not preclude any other available
34	civil or criminal remedies. Any relief granted by the court shall be for a fixed period of time not

1	to exceed three (3) years, at the expiration of which thrie the court may extend any order upon
2	motion of the plaintiff for such additional time as it deems necessary to protect the plaintiff from
3	abuse. The court may modify its order at any time upon motion of either party.
4	(o)(1)(1) Any violation of a protective order under this chapter of which the defendant has
5	actual notice shall be a misdemeanor that shall be punished by a fine of no more than one
6	thousand dollars (\$1,000) or by imprisonment for not more than one year, or both.
7	(p)(2) The penalties for violation of this section shall also include the penalties provided
8	under § 12-29-5.
9	(q)(m) "Actual notice" means that the defendant has received a copy of the order by
10	service thereof or by being handed a copy of the order by a police officer pursuant to § 8-8.1-5(d).
11	(r)(n) The district court shall have criminal jurisdiction over all violations of this chapter.
12	SECTION 2. Section 15-15-3 of the General Laws in Chapter 15-15 entitled "Domestic
13	Abuse Prevention" is hereby amended to read as follows:
14	15-15-3. Protective orders Penalty Jurisdiction.
15	(a) A person, or a parent, custodian, or legal guardian on behalf of a minor child or the
16	director of the department of children, youth and families ("DCYF") or its designee for a child in
17	the custody of DCYF, pursuant to §§ 40-11-7 and 40-11-7.1, suffering from domestic abuse or
18	sexual exploitation as defined in § 15-15-1, may file a complaint in the family court requesting
19	any order that will protect and support her or him that person from abuse or sexual exploitation,
20	including, but not limited to, <u>any or all of</u> the following <u>terms</u> :
21	(1) Ordering that the defendant be restrained and enjoined from contacting, assaulting,
22	molesting, sexually exploiting, or interfering with the plaintiff at home, on the street, or
23	elsewhere, whether the defendant is an adult or a minor;
24	(2) Ordering the defendant to vacate the household immediately;
25	(3) Awarding the plaintiff custody of the minor children of the parties, if any;
26	(4) Ordering the defendant to surrender physical possession of all firearms in his or her
27	possession, care, custody, or control and shall further order ordering a person so restrained not to
28	purchase or receive, or attempt to purchase or receive, any firearms while the protective order is
29	in effect. The defendant shall surrender said firearms within twenty four (24) hours of notice of
30	the protective order to the Rhode Island state police or local police department or to a federally
31	licensed firearms dealer.
32	(5) Ordering, after notice to the defendant and a hearing, either party to make payments
33	for support of a minor child or children of the parties as required by law for a period not to exceed
34	ninety (90) days, unless the child support order is for a child or children receiving public

1	assistance pursuant to chapter 5.1 of title 40. In these cases, legal counsel for the department of
2	human services, office of child support enforcement, shall be notified as a party in interest to
3	appear for the purpose of establishing a child support order under a new or existing docket
4	number previously assigned to the parties and not under the protective docket number. The child
5	support order shall remain in effect until the court modifies or suspends the order.
6	(b) Upon a finding of immediate risk or injury or harm pursuant to § 15-15-4, the court
7	shall, in addition to any other relief granted, enter an ex parte order granting the relief requested,
8	including ordering the immediate surrender of any firearms in the defendant's possession, care,
9	custody or control and prohibiting the defendant from purchasing, receiving or attempting to
10	purchase or receive any firearms, pending a hearing on the merits within twenty-one (21) days.
11	(1) A defendant ordered to surrender firearms shall, within twenty-four (24) hours of
12	notice of the protective order, surrender all firearms to the Rhode Island state police or local
13	police department or to a federally licensed firearms dealer.
14	(i)(2) A person ordered to surrender possession of any firearm(s) pursuant to this section
15	shall, within seventy-two (72) hours after being served with the order, either:
16	(A)(i) File with the court a receipt showing the firearm(s) was physically surrendered to
17	the Rhode Island state police or local police department, or to a federally licensed firearms dealer;
18	or
19	(B)(ii) Attest to the court that, at the time of the order, the person ordered to surrender

The owner of any firearm(s) sold shall receive any financial value received from its sale, less the cost associated with taking possession of, storing, and transferring of the firearm(s).

(iii)(vi) Every individual to whom ownership of a firearm(s) is transferred pursuant to this subsection shall be prohibited from transferring or returning any firearm(s) to the person restrained under this section while the protective order remains in effect and shall be informed of this prohibition, Any knowing violation of this subsection is a felony that shall be punishable by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or by imprisonment for a term of not less than one year and not more than five (5) years, or both.

(iv)(vii) An individual to whom ownership of a firearm(s) is transferred pursuant to this subsection shall return a firearm(s) to the person formerly restrained under this section only if the person formerly restrained under this section provides documentation issued by a court indicating that the restraining order issued pursuant to this section that prohibited the person from purchasing, carrying, transporting, or possessing firearms has expired and has not been extended;

(5) After notice to the respondent and a hearing, ordering either party to make payments for the support of a minor child or children of the parties as required by law for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days, unless the child support order is for a child or children receiving public assistance pursuant to chapter 5.1 of title 40. In these cases, legal counsel for the division of taxation, child support enforcement, shall be notified as a party in interest to appear for the purpose of establishing a child support order under a new or existing docket number previously assigned to the parties and not under the protective docket number. The child support order shall remain in effect until the court modifies or suspends the order.

(b)(c) After notice to the respondent defendant and after a hearing, which shall be held within fifteen (15) days of surrendering said firearms, if the complaint is granted, the court, in addition to any other restrictions, may, for any protective order issued after or renewed on or after July 1, 2017, continue the order of surrender, and shall further order a person restrained under this section not to purchase or receive, or attempt to purchase or receive, any firearms while the protective order is in effect shall make whatever orders it deems necessary for the protection of the plaintiff from abuse, and in addition, the court shall extend the ex parte order of firearm(s)
