1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to prohibit the use of certain explosive targets in the Black
2 Hills Forest Fire Protection District.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That chapter 34-35 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as
5 follows:

6 No person may use a firearm target in the Black Hills Forest Fire Protection District if that
7 target is designed to explode upon a bullet's impact and if that target is made of such materials
8 that a fire may start because of such impact. Any violation of this section is a Class 2
9 misdemeanor. Any person who violates this section is liable for any damages for any injuries
10 caused by a resulting fire. This section does not apply to any target used in a designated shooting
