## **Senate Concurrent Resolution 603**

SENATE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES ENGROSSED

Introduced by: Senator Nesiba

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Recognizing the importance of gun safety.

2 WHEREAS, public safety is paramount, it is desirable for citizens of the state of South 3 Dakota to reduce gun deaths and at the same time to fully respect the freedoms guaranteed 4 by the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution; and 5 WHEREAS, every day, one hundred Americans die by firearm and others are injured by 6 firearms1; and 7 WHEREAS, in the years 2004-2015, there were 798 firearm suicides in South Dakota, the 8 most common method used2; and 9 WHEREAS, in 2017, more South Dakotans died due to firearms (101 deaths) than by drug 10 overdoses (73 deaths)<sup>3</sup>; and

WHEREAS, according to the most recent data from the Centers for Disease Control and
Prevention, South Dakota had the 6th highest rate of suicide in the United States<sup>4</sup>; and

13 <u>WHEREAS</u>, sixty-four percent of South Dakota veteran suicides in 2015 were by firearm<sup>5</sup>:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the Ninety-Fifth Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the House of Representatives concurring therein, encourage all citizens of the great state of South Dakota to support their communities' efforts to honor and value human lives by recognizing the importance of gun safety.
