- 1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Commending the nation of Israel for its cordial relationship
- with the United States and with the State of South Dakota.
- 3 WHEREAS, Israel has been granted her lands under and through the oldest recorded deed,
- 4 as recorded in the Old Testament, a tome of scripture held sacred and revered by Jews and
- 5 Christians, alike, as presenting the acts and words of God; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the claim and presence of the Jewish people in Israel has remained constant
- 7 throughout the past 4,000 years of history; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the legal basis for the establishment of the State of Israel was a binding
- 9 resolution under international law, which was unanimously adopted by the League of Nations
- in 1922 and subsequently affirmed by both houses of the United States Congress; and
- WHEREAS, this resolution affirmed the establishment of a national home for the Jewish

1 people in the historical region of the Land of Israel, including areas of Judea, Samaria, and

- 2 Jerusalem; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Article 80 of the United Nations charter recognized the continued validity of
- 4 the rights granted to states or peoples which already existed under international instruments.
- 5 Therefore, the 1922 League of Nations resolution remains valid, and the 650,000 Jews currently
- 6 residing in the areas of Judea, Samaria, and eastern Jerusalem reside there legitimately; and
- WHEREAS, Israel declared its independence and self-governance on May 14, 1948, with
- 8 the goal of reestablishing its God-given and legally recognized lands as a homeland for the
- 9 Jewish people; and
- WHEREAS, the United States, having been the first country to recognize Israel as an
- independent nation and as Israel's principal ally, has enjoyed a close relationship with Israel and
- her people; and
- WHEREAS, Israel is the greatest friend and ally of the United States in the Middle East, and
- 14 the values of our two nations are so intertwined that it is impossible to separate one from the
- 15 other; and
- WHEREAS, there are those in the Middle East who have continually sought to destroy
- 17 Israel, from the time of its inception as a state, and many of those who demonstrate animosity
- toward Israel also demonstrate animosity toward the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the United States and the State of South Dakota and have enjoyed a cordial
- 20 relationship with Israel since 1948, a friendship that continues to strengthen with each passing
- 21 year:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the Eighty-
- 23 Eighth Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the Senate concurring therein, that the South
- 24 Dakota Legislature commends Israel for its cordial and steadfast relationship with the United

- 1 States and with the State of South Dakota and supports Israel in its legal, historical, moral, and
- 2 God-given right of self-governance and self-defense upon the entirety of its own lands,
- 3 recognizing that Israel is neither an attacking force nor an occupier of the lands of others, and
- 4 that peace can be afforded the region only through a whole and united Israel governed under one
- 5 law for all people.
