Mr. MURPHY (for himself, Ms. BALDWIN, Mr. BLUMENTHAL, Mr. BOOKER, Ms. KLOBUCHAR, Mr. SCHATZ, Mr. SCHIFF, and Mr. VAN HOLLEN) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To establish the Office of Gun Violence Prevention, and
for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Office of Gun Violence
5 Prevention Act of 2025”.

6 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

7 In this Act:

8 (1) ADVISORY COUNCIL.—The term “Advisory
9 Council” means the advisory council established
10 under section 3(c)(1).

1 (2) DIRECTOR.—The term “Director” means
2 the Director of the Office.

3 (3) GUN VIOLENCE.—The term “gun violence”
4 includes homicide, violent crime, domestic violence,
5 attempted suicide, suicide, and unintentional death
6 or injury involving a firearm.

7 (4) OFFICE.—The term “Office” means the Of-
8 fice of Gun Violence Prevention established under
9 section 3(a).

10 **SEC. 3. OFFICE OF GUN VIOLENCE PREVENTION.**

11 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—

12 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney General shall
13 establish within the Office of Legal Policy of the De-
14 partment of Justice the Office of Gun Violence Pre-
15 vention.

16 (2) DIRECTOR.—The Attorney General shall
17 appoint a Director to be the head of the Office.

18 (b) DUTIES.—

19 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Director, in consulta-
20 tion with the Advisory Council, shall coordinate, in-
21 tegrate, and maximize the efficacy of each responsi-
22 bility, program, and service relating to gun violence
23 prevention administered by the Attorney General to
24 maximize an integrated approach to reducing gun vi-

1 olence and serving victims of gun violence, includ-
2 ing—

(4) DATA.—The Director, in consultation with the Advisory Council, shall—

(B) develop a plan to collect and analyze the data described in subparagraph (A).

21 (6) EDUCATION.—The Director, in consultation
22 with the Advisory Council, shall educate the general
23 public about Federal laws, regulations, and grant
24 programs relating to gun violence prevention, includ-

1 ing by conducting education and awareness cam-
2 paigns—

3 (A) directed at—

4 (i) owners of firearms;

5 (ii) parents and legal guardians of mi-
6 nors; and

7 (iii) professionals who provide services
8 to individuals and communities dispropor-
9 tionately impacted by gun violence; and

10 (B) that include education relating to the
11 secure storage or firearms and suicide preven-
12 tion.

13 (7) CRISIS RESPONSE.—The Director, in con-
14 sultation with the Advisory Council, shall assist com-
15 munities that have experienced gun violence (such as
16 a mass shooting, a school shooting, a gang-related
17 shooting, or a domestic violence shooting) with crisis
18 response activities, including providing information
19 about and increasing access to—

20 (A) mental health services for members of
21 the community;

22 (B) anti-gun trafficking activities;

23 (C) crisis response training for first re-
24 sponders and offices of gun violence prevention
25 serving the community; and

(D) suicide prevention services for members of the community.

(A) the Department of Health and Human Services;

(B) the Department of Veterans Affairs;

10 (C) the Department of Education;

(D) the Department of Housing and Urban Development;

13 (E) the Department of Commerce;

14 (F) the Department of Homeland Security;

15 (G) the Department of Defense;

16 (H) the Department of the Interior;

17 (I) the Department of Labor;

18 (J) the Department of Agriculture;

19 (K) the Small Business Administration;

22 (M) the Federal Trade Commission; and

(N) the United States Sentencing Commission.

1 (9) ANNUAL REPORT.—Not later than 1 year
2 after the date of enactment of this Act, and annually
3 thereafter, the Director shall submit to Congress a
4 report that includes—

5 (A) information on the state of gun vio-
6 lence in the United States;

7 (B) recommendations for policy initiatives
8 and legislation to reduce gun violence in the
9 United States; and

10 (C) a description of the efforts of the Di-
11 rector to carry out the duties under this sub-
12 section.

13 (c) ADVISORY COUNCIL.—

14 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days
15 after the date of enactment of this Act, and not less
16 frequently than quarterly thereafter, the Attorney
17 General shall convene an advisory council—

18 (A) chaired by the Director; and

19 (B) the membership of which includes the
20 following individuals or a designee of the indi-
21 vidual:

22 (i) The Deputy Attorney General.

23 (ii) The Associate Attorney General.

24 (iii) The Assistant Attorney General
25 for the Office of Legal Policy.

(iv) The Assistant Attorney General
for the Office of Justice Programs.

(v) The Assistant Attorney General
for the Criminal Division.

(vi) The Director of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives.

(vii) The Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

11 (ix) The Director of the Office on Vio-
12 lence Against Women.

15 (xi) The Director of the Bureau of
16 Justice Statistics

(2) ADDITIONAL MEMBERS —

(B) REPRESENTATIVES.—The additional members described in subparagraph (A) shall include not fewer than 1—

- (i) survivor of gun violence;
 - (ii) community violence intervention service provider;
 - (iii) public health official;
 - (iv) medical professional who provides trauma care;
 - (v) mental health clinician;
 - (vi) official from a department of justice of a State;
 - (vii) State or local public health department official;
 - (viii) teacher;
 - (ix) member of a student group; and
 - (x) veteran.

18 (d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
19 are authorized to be appropriated such sums as are nec-
20 essary to carry out this section.
