A BILL

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to authorize expenditures to combat emerging terrorist threats, including vehicular attacks, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Shielding Public Spaces*
5 *from Vehicular Terrorism Act”.*

6 **SEC. 2. RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT.**

7 *The Homeland Security Act of 2002 is amended—*

8 (1) *in paragraph (11) of section 302 (6 U.S.C.*
9 *182), by inserting “research and development to com-*
10 *bat emerging terrorist threats, such as vehicular at-*
11 *tacks, and” before “the long-term”; and*

12 (2) *in subparagraph (B) of section 308(b)(2) (6*
13 *U.S.C. 188(b)(2))—*

14 (A) *in the matter preceding clause (i), by*
15 *striking “expertise in—” and inserting “exper-*
16 *tise in the following:”;*

17 (B) *by redesignating clause (xiv) as clause*
18 *(xv); and*

19 (C) *by inserting after clause (xiii) the fol-*
20 *lowing new clause:*

21 “(xiv) *Combatting emerging terrorist*
22 *threats, including vehicular attacks.”.*

23 **SEC. 3. ALLOWABLE USES.**

24 *Section 2008 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002*
25 *(6 U.S.C. 609) is amended—*

1 (1) in subsection (a)—

2 (A) by redesignating paragraphs (11)
3 through (14) as paragraphs (12) through (15),
4 respectively; and

5 (B) by inserting after paragraph (10) the
6 following new paragraph:

7 “(11) addressing security vulnerabilities of pub-
8 lic spaces, including through the installation of
9 bollards and other target hardening activities;”; and

10 (2) in subsection (b)—

11 (A) in paragraph (3)(B), by striking
12 “(a)(10)” and inserting “(a)(12)”; and

13 (B) by adding at the end the following new
14 paragraph:

15 “(6) FIREARMS.—

16 “(A) IN GENERAL.—A grant awarded under
17 section 2003 or 2004 may not be used for the
18 provision to any person of a firearm or training
19 in the use of a firearm.

20 “(B) NO EFFECT ON OTHER LAWS.—Noth-
21 ing in this paragraph may be construed to pre-
22 clude or contradict any other provision of law
23 authorizing the provision of firearms or training
24 in the use of firearms.”.

1 **SEC. 4. REPORT.**

2 *The Secretary of Homeland Security shall submit to*
3 *the Committee on Homeland Security of the House of Rep-*
4 *resentatives and the Committee on Homeland Security and*
5 *Governmental Affairs of the Senate a report on emerging*
6 *automotive technologies that support driverless vehicles and*
7 *the threat such vehicles may pose to people in public spaces.*
8 *Such report shall also address risks associated with cyber*
9 *terrorism and computer-dependent automotive vehicles.*
