To establish a Gun Safety Board, and for other purposes.

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## IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. DESAULNIER introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

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# A BILL

To establish a Gun Safety Board, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

**3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Gun Safety Board and  
5 Research Act”.

**6 SEC. 2. GUN SAFETY BOARD.**

7       (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Secretary of Health and  
8 Human Services shall, not later than 1 year after the date  
9 of enactment of this Act, establish a board to be known  
10 as the Gun Safety Board.

11       (b) DUTIES.—The Gun Safety Board shall—

(A) conduct original research about firearm violence reduction (including research about topics identified for additional research by the Gun Safety Board under paragraph (3)); and

15 (ii) ways to reduce firearm violence;

(B) a list of subject areas related to fire-arm violence reduction that the Gun Safety Board finds would benefit from additional scientific research; and

(C) the Gun Safety Board's findings about the efficacy of existing State and Federal laws intended to reduce firearm violence, and the expected efficacy of proposed State and Federal legislation intended to reduce firearm violence, in reducing—

- (i) domestic violence;
  - (ii) suicide and attempted suicide;
  - (iii) chronic community violence;
  - (iv) police violence;
  - (v) mass shootings;
  - (vi) hate crimes;
  - (vii) school shootings;
  - (viii) health care-related expenditures  
including lost days of work and other individual  
expenditures) for victims of firearm-  
related injuries;
  - (ix) hospital interventions;
  - (x) broader socioeconomic impacts of  
gun violence;

#### 4 (c) MEMBERSHIP.—

9                   (2) COMPOSITION.—The members shall in-  
10               clude—

(A) 1 member with expertise in public health;

15 (C) 1 member with expertise in firearm vi-  
16 olence reduction research;

(D) 1 member with expertise in trauma surgery:

(E) 1 member with expertise in law enforcement:

(F) 1 member with a background in firearms manufacturing, firearm sales, professional firearm use, or recreational firearm use;

(G) 2 members representing victims of  
firearm violence;

- 1 (H) 1 member representing a nonprofit or-  
2 ganization that advocates for racial justice;

3 (I) 1 member representing a nonprofit or-  
4 ganization that advocates or engages in firearm  
5 violence intervention or prevention; and

6 (J) 1 member from each of—

7 (i) the National Institutes of Health;

8 (ii) the Centers for Disease Control  
9 and Prevention;

10 (iii) the Substance Abuse and Mental  
11 Health Services Administration;

12 (iv) the United States Consumer  
13 Product Safety Commission;

14 (v) the Federal Bureau of Investiga-  
15 tion;

16 (vi) the Department of Health and  
17 Human Services;

18 (vii) the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco,  
19 Firearms, and Explosives within the De-  
20 partment of Justice;

21 (viii) the Office of Juvenile Justice  
22 and Delinquency Prevention within the De-  
23 partment of Justice;

24 (ix) the Bureau of Justice Assistance  
25 within the Department of Justice;

(x) the Office for Victims of Crime  
within the Department of Justice;

3 (xi) the Office on Violence Against  
4 Women within the Department of Justice;  
5 and

(xii) the National Institute of Justice  
within the Department of Justice.

8 (d) TERMS.—

1 term for which the member's predecessor was ap-  
2 pointed shall be appointed only for the remainder of  
3 that term. A vacancy shall be filled in the manner  
4 in which the original appointment was made.

5 (e) BASIC PAY.—Members shall be paid at a rate set  
6 by the Secretary of Health and Human Services that is  
7 consistent with title 5, United States Code.

8 (f) TRAVEL EXPENSES.—Each member shall receive  
9 travel expenses, including per diem in lieu of subsistence,  
10 in accordance with applicable provisions under subchapter  
11 I of chapter 57 of title 5, United States Code.

12 (g) CHAIR.—The Secretary of Health and Human  
13 Services shall designate 1 member to serve as chair of the  
14 Gun Safety Board.

15 (h) VICE CHAIR.—The members of the Gun Safety  
16 Board shall elect 1 member to serve as vice chair of the  
17 Gun Safety Board.

18 (i) MEETINGS.—The Board shall meet at least once  
19 each month at the call of the chair.

20 (j) STAFF.—The chair may appoint and, consistent  
21 with title 5, United States Code, fix the pay of additional  
22 personnel as the chair considers appropriate.

23 (k) FIREARM.—For the purposes of this Act, the  
24 term “firearm” shall have the meaning given the term in  
25 section 921 of title 18, United States Code.

1       (l) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is  
2 authorized to be appropriated to carry out this Act  
3 \$5,000,000 for each of the first 2 fiscal years beginning  
4 after the date of the enactment of this Act, and  
5 \$25,000,000 for each fiscal year thereafter.

6       (m) PROHIBITION ON DIVERSION OF OTHER FED-  
7 ERAL GUN VIOLENCE RESEARCH FUNDS.—The amounts  
8 made available for Federal gun violence research other  
9 than under this Act shall not be reduced in order to pro-  
10 vide funds to carry out this Act.
