A BILL

To modernize Federal firearms laws to account for advancements in technology and less-than-lethal weapons, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Law Enforcement Inno-*
5 *vate to De-Escalate Act”.*

6 **SEC. 2. EXEMPTION OF CERTAIN LESS-THAN-LETHAL PRO-**
7 **JECTILE DEVICES FROM RESTRICTIONS**
8 **UNDER TITLE 18, UNITED STATES CODE.**

9 *(a) IN GENERAL.—Section 921(a) of title 18, United*
10 *States Code, is amended—*

11 *(1) in the 2nd sentence of paragraph (3), by in-*
12 *serting “or a less-than-lethal projectile device” before*
13 *the period; and*

14 *(2) by adding at the end the following:*

15 *“(38) The term ‘less-than-lethal projectile device’*
16 *means a device with a bore or multiple bores, that—*

17 *“(A) is not designed or intended to expel a pro-*
18 *jectile at a velocity exceeding 500 feet per second by*
19 *any means; and*

20 *“(B) is designed or intended to be used in a*
21 *manner that is not likely to cause death or serious*
22 *bodily injury.”.*

1 **SEC. 3. EXEMPTION OF CERTAIN LESS-THAN-LETHAL PRO-**
2 **JECTILE DEVICES FROM FIREARMS AND AM-**
3 **MUNITION TAX.**

4 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—Section 4182 of the Internal Rev-
5 enue Code of 1986 is amended by redesignating subsection
6 (d) as subsection (e) and by inserting after subsection (c)
7 the following new subsection:

8 “(d) *LESS-THAN-LETHAL PROJECTILE DEVICES.*—

9 “(1) *IN GENERAL.*—The tax imposed by section
10 4181 shall not apply to—

11 “(A) any less-than-lethal projectile device,

12 “(B) any device contained on the most re-
13 cent list made available by the Secretary under
14 paragraph (3)(B), and

15 “(C) any shell or cartridge that meets the
16 requirement of paragraph (2)(B) and is designed
17 for use in a device referred to in subparagraph
18 (A) or (B).

19 “(2) *LESS-THAN-LETHAL PROJECTILE DEVICE.*—
20 The term ‘less-than-lethal projectile device’ means a
21 device with a bore or multiple bores, that—

22 “(A) is not designed or intended to expel a
23 projectile at a velocity exceeding 500 feet per sec-
24 ond by any means, and

1 “(B) is designed or intended to be used in
2 a manner that is not likely to cause death or se-
3 rious bodily injury.

4 “(3) ANNUAL REVIEW OF NEW AND EMERGING
5 TECHNOLOGIES.—

6 “(A) LIST OF LESS-THAN-LETHAL PROJEC-
7 TILE DEVICES.—The Secretary shall make pub-
8 licly available a list of devices that the Secretary
9 has determined are described in paragraph (2)
10 and shall update such list annually to take into
11 account new devices.

12 “(B) LIST OF NON-LETHAL DEVICES THE
13 PROJECTILES OF WHICH EXCEED 500 FEET PER
14 SECOND.—

15 “(i) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall
16 make publicly available a list of devices
17 that the Secretary has determined are not
18 described in paragraph (2) but would be so
19 described if such paragraph were applied
20 without regard to subparagraph (A) thereof,
21 and shall update such list annually to take
22 into account new devices.

23 “(ii) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—The Sec-
24 retary shall annually submit a written re-
25 port to the Committee on Ways and Means

1 of the House of Representatives and the
2 Committee on Finance of the Senate regard-
3 ing the annual list of devices described in
4 clause (i), including a copy of such list, a
5 description of the devices that were consid-
6 ered for inclusion on such list, and the rea-
7 sons for including or excluding such devices
8 from such list.”.

9 (b) *EFFECTIVE DATE.*—The amendments made by this
10 section shall apply to articles sold by the manufacturer,
11 producer, or importer after the date of the enactment of this
12 Act.

13 **SEC. 4. EXEMPTION OF CERTAIN LESS-THAN-LETHAL PRO-**
14 **JECTILE DEVICES FROM NATIONAL FIRE-**
15 **ARMS ACT.**

16 Section 5845(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986
17 is amended by striking “an antique firearm or” and insert-
18 ing “any antique firearm, any less-than-lethal projectile de-
19 vice (as defined in section 4182(d)(2)), any device referred
20 to in section 4182(d)(1)(B), or”.
