33	(1) A law enforcement agency as defined in Section 53-1-102 that has in its possession
34	<u>a firearm</u> after it has been used for court [purposes] proceedings shall determine the [true] legal
35	owner of the [weapon and return it to him; however, if unable to determine the true owner of
36	the weapon, or if the true owner is the person committing the crime for which the weapon was
37	used as evidence, the department shall confiscate it and it shall revert to that agency for their
