28	76-10-522. Alteration of number or mark on pistol or revolver.
29	(1) Any person who changes, alters, removes, or obliterates the name of the maker, the
30	model, manufacturer's number, or other mark of identification, including any distinguishing
31	number or mark assigned by the Department of Public Safety, on any [pistol or revolver]
32	firearm, without first having secured written permission from the Department of Public Safety
33	to make the change, alteration, or removal, is guilty of a [class A misdemeanor] third degree
34	<u>felony</u> .
35	(2) Any person who is found in possession of a firearm which has been altered as
36	described in Subsection (1) is guilty of a third degree felony.
