A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; creating the offense
2 of burglary for minor theft; specifying elements and
3 penalties of the offense; and providing for an effective date.

5 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

6

7 **Section 1.** W.S. 6-3-301 by creating new subsections (e)
8 and (f) is amended to read:

9

10 **6-3-301. Burglary; aggravated burglary; burglary for**
11 **minor theft; penalties.**

13 (e) A person is guilty of burglary for minor theft if,
14 without authority, he enters or remains in a building,

1 occupied structure or vehicle, or separately secured or
2 occupied portion thereof, with intent to commit theft and:

3
4 (i) Commits no theft or commits a theft of
5 property with a value of less than one thousand dollars
6 (\$1,000.00) in the course of committing the crime;

7
8 (ii) Did not enter with intent to commit a felony
9 and commits no felony in the course of committing the crime;

10
11 (iii) The building, structure or vehicle was not
12 locked and was not in fact occupied at the time of entry;

13
14 (iv) The building, structure or vehicle was not
15 designed or adapted for overnight accommodation; and

16
17 (v) The crime did not involve theft of a firearm.

18
19 (f) Burglary for minor theft is a misdemeanor
20 punishable by imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, a
21 fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), or
22 both.

1 **Section 2.** This act is effective July 1, 2019.
